Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

Gracious God, the risen savior walked with his disciples and turned their grief into joy. Walk also with us along our path of service and cheer us with your presence. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" (Luke 24:30-32)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

Two travelers walked a lonely highway mourning their friend, mentor, and teacher. One quiet stranger would change everything.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

- What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?
- Who in your community is hungry? How might feed them?
- What things are your eyes closed to, that you could be looking at in your own life? How might you face some of those things this week? Who can help you see and work through the difficult issues you face?
- For the littles: Who do you eat meals with? What's your favorite thing to talk about when you share a meal?



Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

Eat, share, and let Jesus be revealed to you. Amen.



Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Invite to dinner someone you don't know well – a coworker, your kids' friends' parents, someone homebound from your congregation, a lonely neighbor. Notice how Christ shows up simply by sharing a meal.
