Jesus disappeared. Cleopas and Salome ran back to Jerusalem to tell their friends they had seen Jesus.



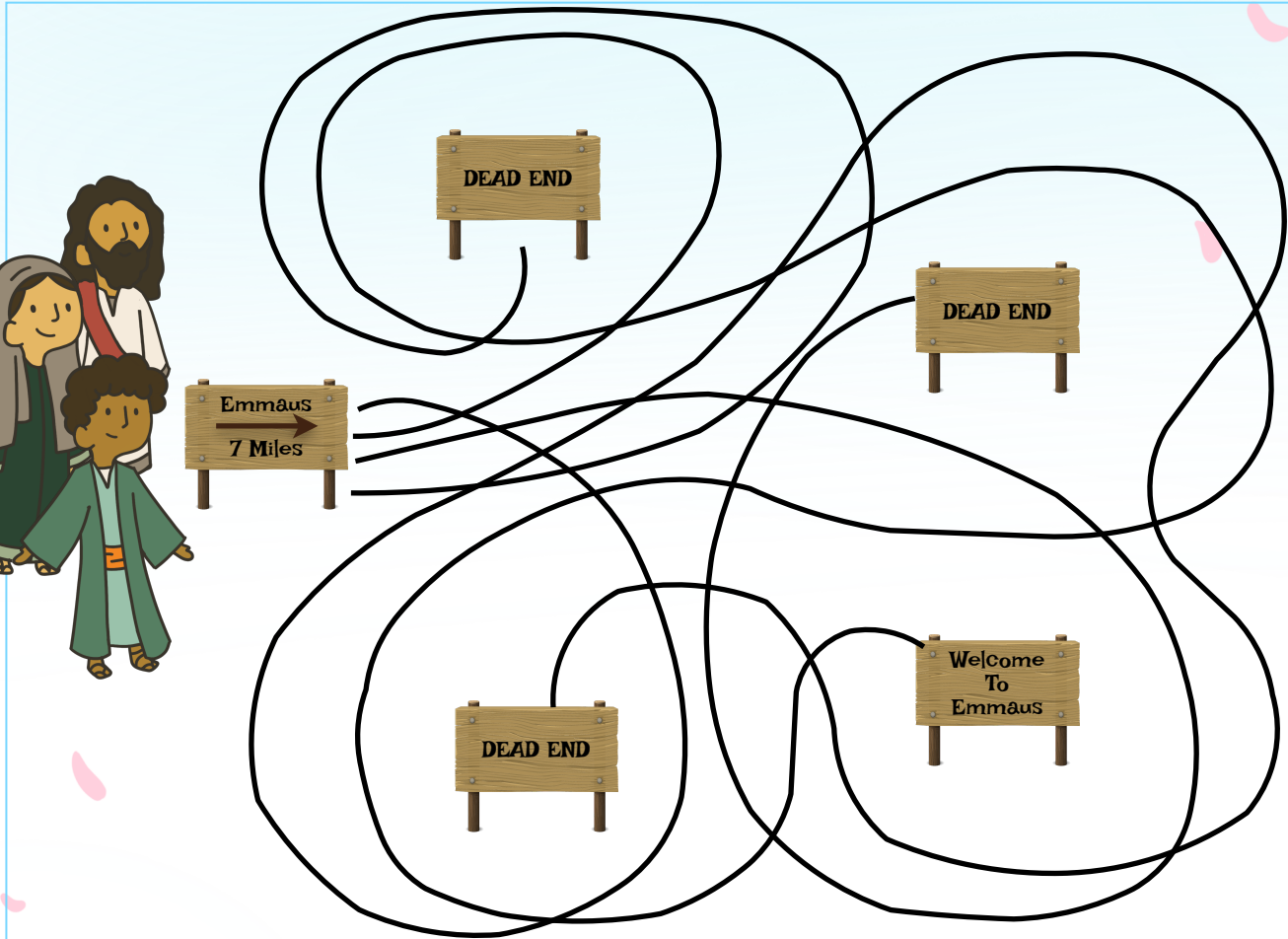
REMEMBER THIS
