From the Pastor

An Eastertide message

She listens, listens, holding her breath. Surely that voice is his — the one who had looked at her, once, across the crowd, as no one ever had looked? Had seen her? Had spoken as if to her? Surely those hands were his, taking the platter of bread from hers just now? Hands he'd laid on the dying and made them well? Surely that face —? The man they'd crucified for sedition and blasphemy. The man whose body disappeared from its tomb. The man it was rumored now some women had seen this morning, alive? Those who had brought this stranger home to their table don't recognize yet with whom they sit. But she in the kitchen, absently touching the winejug she's to take in, a young Black servant intently listening, swings round and sees the light around him and is sure.

The poet, Denise Levertov was born in England and emigrated to the United States as a young adult. By the time of her death in 1997, she had published nearly fifty volumes of poems, prose, and translations. She taught at several universities, including Stanford, where she converted to Christianity at the age of 60 — and a few years later, gathered together many of her poems on religious themes into one remarkable volume, The Stream & the Sapphire. Of that collection, Levertov wrote that her aim was to "trace my slow movement from agnosticism to Christian faith, a movement incorporating much doubt and questioning as well as affirmation."

Eastertide, the 50 days between Easter and Pentecost (this year May 28), is the time for us too, to have our eyes opened and hearts warmed to the message of Jesus Christ, died and risen. Imagine. Levertov was 60 years old when she had that experience. It is never too late to turn our hearts to God's grace. It is never too late to pray for those who don't recognize Christ...yet. Jesus is always ready to welcome you, always ready to be with you, always ready to love and forgive you.

As the hymn asks, "How can I keep from singing?" how can we keep from sharing the good news of God's love and grace? Share this good news so that others' eyes can be opened, and their hearts warmed, too.

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes - April 3, 2023 (not yet approved)

Members present: Pastor Denise Fossen, Kristi Ehrenberg (president), Marilyn Chindvall (vice president) and Lay Ministry, Becky Parker (treasurer), Kari Dorry-Youth & Family, Kim Anderson-Evangelism, Kaitlyn Burdorf-Christian Education, Glenn Henningson-Church Properties, and Barbara Wegner-Secretary.

Meeting was called to order by President Kristi Ehrenberg at 7:48 pm.

So far there have been no volunteers to go to the Synod Assembly June 9-10th. There are a few people who may be able to but are still waiting to see if it will work out with their schedules. We save money by registering early so it would be good if we knew. The council decided May 8th would work the best for the next council meeting since May 1st would make it difficult to get the April financials together in time. Boards may meet at other times & send 1 speaker to the meeting. The council would like to keep the official minutes off the website (besides being in the newsletter as *unofficial*) but would like the upcoming agenda to be on the website so long as it's not got specifics on it. The council wanted to have communion procession and Kari, Becky, and Kelsey volunteered to be lay assistants at the 9 am service.

Approval of March Minutes. Kari & Kim MSP.

Approval of March Treasurer's Report. We are ahead of last year at this time, but we we're behind, so had to transfer \$5,000 out of the Operating Reserve to cover the deficit. The "professional expense" amount will be investigated as it shouldn't be there. The expense for Living Lutheran magazine will disappear as they've stopped printing them. Marilyn & Kaitlyn MSP.

Marilyn Hanson for WAM has a way to get some instruments from the school at a very good price. There's \$142 in praise band funds & \$523 in Dave Ramsey course. Becky wanted to move the money from the course to the praise band to get these instruments. Kari texted Kirsten Karels to check if she was alright with that. Council moved on while awaiting response. **Board of Lay Ministry** – Marilyn Chindvall - Accepted WAM minutes. We are doing the senior acolyte gifts with Christian Ed. Marilyn will talk with Carol Thompson about engraved crosses. Pastor Renee Tecklenburg will do pulpit supply for us via Zoom on April 16th and June 18th. Pastor needs coverage on May 21st for continuing ed. Becky will ask Pastor Renee if she will be able to cover it. Pastor Janet from Zion will do pastoral care while Pastor Denise is away. Kirsten is the only one on the board with her term up, so she'll be asked if she wants to continue. Because it was a small group they didn't discuss the safety committee.

Board of Evangelism – Kim Anderson - For the summer monthly hymn sing, Kim is still verifying if the 2nd Wednesday in June, July, and August at 4 o'clock will work for Fairway View. They're still working on Mission Emphasis Sunday. The board will present Mother's Day flowers to mothers and those who provide motherly care as they exit church that day. There were no transfers in or out. The directory is put on hold for one year or until more people come back to church. Money from the Advent Giving Tree was designated in December. This amount would be eligible for a percentage additional if we get it to the food shelf by April 9th. Approval to give that \$597 from the Advent Giving Tree to the food shelf to get that extra percentage and help the food shelf out more. Kim & Becky **MSP**

The bulletin board will be changed for Easter Sunday by Marla and Jane. Kim continues to call for volunteers up at Fairway View (FWV). FWV Ministry assistants will no longer have to bring the service video on a flash drive, but may use Facebook on the TV screen. In the cabinet by the sink counter there's a sound system, and that power button has to be turned on. Above the sink, open the cupboard door, there's a key there that will open that. According to FVW, assistants need to find someone from FWV, but they can be difficult to find. The secretary doesn't need the flash drive to get the service. Marina is aware she won't need to give someone a flash drive. Becky will need a flash drive for Pastor Renee. The board will look for candidates to fill the open positions.

Christian Education – Kaitlyn Burdorf - The board has messaged people about board replacements. The rest of the Sunday School year is all planned out. The last day of Sunday School (May 21st) they will do a thank you during church service for all of the volunteers. For senior recognition gifts the board talked with Lay Ministry. Carmen will talk with Hannah to see if she wants to come for Senior Recognition. The children will sing April 30th with the church choir. They will also go to FWV after service.

Youth & Family – Kari Dorry - Dean is planning on setting up for the Easter breakfast. There should be enough volunteers for that. There will be two lines for serving. Senior Sunday is May 7th and we didn't have volunteers to serve cake. The coffee assistants should be able to serve the cake. Barbara should order the cake Bill's Supervalu. It should be a full sheet cake with the senior names on it, which we will have to wait to hear if Hannah wants to do it. To recognize youth group and kid's club volunteers Youth & Family will be a part of the Christian Ed thank you in church on May 21st. Great to hear we're getting applicants for the Youth Leadership position. We're working on a May Day fundraiser. Marilyn & the Kid's Club will be weaving May Day baskets. Kirsten texted & said it is ok to move the money from Dave Ramsey to Praise Band. Approval to move money to Praise Band instrument acquisition. Becky & Kim MSP.

Stewardship – Becky said they didn't meet because there was nothing to discuss on the agenda.

Church Properties – Glenn Henningson - Spring Cleanup is set for April 24th. Board discussed the bells and getting someone to look at them. We'll have to look at working on some of the long term needs in Spring. Scratching the Luther Rose off the list because it's a lot of maintenance and it still won't last long. Marilyn Chindvall brought up the desire for the water fountain to be fixed, especially with bible school in summer coming up.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Worship: March had midweek Lenten services at FELC and at Fairway View. Thanks for Marilyn Hanson for playing keyboard each midweek service at Fairway View (FWV). FELC is not having a midweek service during Holy Week at FWV. They will have a service.

We had a fair attendance, between 15-20 each week at FWV. Those participating and attending the midweek services at FELC enjoyed the message through drama. Many commented on points of view that they would not have pondered without the messages brought each week in a new way. Many thanks to WAM, and specifically Marilyn Hanson, for recruitment and staging, and for our weekly actors and costumes.

Palm Sunday at FELC included the Sunday School processing, waving palms, and singing the entrance hymn. They also sang two camp songs during the children's message time. Palm Sunday at FWV was lead in person and included over 20 people who waved palms from their seats. Thanks to Kathy Haukos for consistently playing the first Sunday of the month at FWV. It is Holy Week and we are putting final finishes on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter, which includes all those bulletins. Grateful for Barbara, Liz, and the new printer for putting in extra time and work to get this all done, even with snow storms that have impacted actual in-office work.

Pastoral Care: Pastoral care continues through in person, text, calls, and notes. The funeral for Ann Lundberg was held Monday, March 20th. Hospital visits were made to cover Zion's pastor's vacation (I was unaware ahead of time). Pastor Janet Warnes from Zion will cover my vacation next week for emergency pastoral care. The office has her number.

The upcoming Sunday scripture are studied each week at FWV on Tuesday afternoons at 4:00pm. We have two baptisms scheduled for April 30th, Marcus Hanson and Harlow Hintz.

Youth: We continue to advertise for a youth leader.

Community, Synod, and Miscellaneous: Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Steven Cook, has retired effective November 30th. Pastor Naomi Mahler is now in this position.

Upcoming: Vacation planned for April 10th (staff holiday) to April 17th; June 13th – June 19th. Both Sundays Pr. Renea will preach via recorded zoom with Becky (thanks, Becky!).

I will return late that night. Scheduled in May, starting on Monday, the 15th, is the Festival of Homiletics in Minneapolis. "Do not be afraid; go and tell." Easter 2023

As Matthew tells the resurrection story, Matthew 28:1-10, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary had just stepped into a new reality. Jesus had been crucified. The earth itself was shaking. They had no idea what life would be like in the future. If the grave could be empty, there was no telling what else God might be up to. If the risen Jesus could meet them on the road, then maybe he actually could be going ahead of them and meet them as he promised! For as he told them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers and sisters to go to Galilee; there they will see me." (Mt. 28:10)

This Easter, as our congregations tell the resurrection story, we each step into our own new reality. Perhaps it is the first "more normal Easter" that we have been able to look forward to in three years. Thinking back, three

years ago, we were in shock. Two years ago, we were wondering what the "new normal" would be. Last Easter, we had to acknowledge, like St. Paul said, "for now, we see in a mirror dimly" (1 Cor. 13:12). And this year, we cannot be in denial; we know this new time of being the church brings realities yet to be discovered and experienced.

On this holiest day of the church year, Easter Sunday 2023 is an opportunity to speak good news that our world longs to hear more than ever. Some will come to worship because it is an expected family tradition. Some will come because someone invited them to go with them. Some will dare to come to worship in person because you met them where they were online, and now there is something drawing them to beloved community with you. And some will come having the story nearly memorized but knowing they need to hear the old, old story speak to the new reality of their life today.

Whoever the worshipers are, wherever and however they hear the Easter story, the words of Jesus according to Matthew speak a word for today. "Do not be afraid; go and tell." "Do not be afraid" is one of those assurances God knows we need to hear. Again, and again! So, it appears frequently in Scripture. Here in Matthew's Easter story, fear figures prominently and appears four times: "For fear of him....." "Do not be afraid...." "... with fear and great joy..." "Do not be afraid...." What a relevant word that is for Easter 2023! It seems like fear tries to grip us in so many ways.

We are afraid about:

Name

- health issues and emotional well-being our own or of those we love;
- the polarization of our communities and congregations;
- flooding and drought;
- our children's safety while at school;

- peace in Ukraine and in the Middle East;
- the economy;
- the survival of our churches;
- the future of opportunities to even tell the Easter story.
- the health of creation;

Do the words of the living Jesus make a difference this Easter? Yes! Like the Marys, you and I have stepped into a new reality. Sure, it's not what we would have chosen; but this is where, by God's grace, we are standing right now. And like the Marys, by God's grace, Jesus does not just tell us to keep on standing where we are in fear. He says: "Do not be afraid." Calm down. God is on the side of life, and nothing can stop God from loving you. If Jesus could go to the cross and overcome death and the grave with life, be assured that he has the power to give you courage and strength for the living of these days. "Go and tell." Go. Don't freeze where you are. Walking the way of Jesus is THE way to live; it is what it means to have life and have it abundantly. And that is a message too good to keep to oneself. So, go. Be a witness. Tell someone else. "I am going ahead of you." Yes Jesus is out ahead of you, bringing new life before we can even imagine the power and presence of God being there. There is no place where you or I will go that Jesus has not gone already. "Go to Galilee." Jesus and the first followers went to Galilee. You and I are sent to the Galilees of our lives, our communities, our world - to the places and people who look for healing, freedom, forgiveness, faith, love, and belonging. This January, I had the opportunity to walk in the historic and sacred places of the Holy Land, going to the places where Jesus was born and did his ministry – places like Bethlehem and Galilee, holy places where God chose to move, to speak, and to be. They are also places where one hears from the 'living stones' who tell the story of Jesus today. Walking in these historic and holy footsteps changes the way I hear Scripture and the way I see the Holy Spirit at work there and here in our synod.

Dear friends, I give thanks for you and for your faithfulness to tell the Easter story in the cities, farmland, and towns where God has planted you. I pray for each of our congregations as you embody the good news of a living Jesus this Easter and every day. May this living Jesus strengthen your hearts, calm your fears, and send you to go and tell. + Grace, and peace in Christ,

It has been a few months since you have heard from us, though not for lack of news! We returned from our mini-sabbatical with new hope for the future and are walking into it with many unanswered questions, but with faith. We are here and we aren't going anywhere soon!

Our roots are sinking in further into this community and country and there are many opportunities ahead of us. For the time being, the rural hospital of Selian has had high numbers of malnourished children receiving the benefit of a feeding program, the NICU at ALMC is at capacity every day and babies and mothers are surviving and thriving! Doctors and nurses round with Steve every day that he is in the hospital. The rains have started, our children are all doing well, so we have so much for which to be thankful.

RUTF has Arrived! The numbers of malnourished children have risen this month. In February we had 9 children admitted into our feeding program at Selian, and this month we already have had 20 come through the door. The short rains of Dec.-Jan. did not yield good harvests, so hunger is on the rise.

After a long and challenging journey, we have finally received a shipping container of Ready to Use Therapeutic Food (RUTF) from an organization outside of Atlanta, called MANA Nutrition. This will allow us to continue our outpatient program as we discharge the malnourished children from the hospital and follow them into their communities. RUTF is also commonly known as "Plumpy Nut". Each packet has 500 kcals, and has the right balance of carbohydrates,

protein, and fat with added minerals, vitamins, and micronutrients. We are so thankful for this gift given in memory of Prof. Mark Jacobsen.

And... the rains are on our doorstep! The forecast looks promising. After months of waiting, many of us are seriously on the edge of our seats, checking the forecast regularly (a true Minnesotan). We had a heavy rainfall a few days ago which produced huge flooding. We are now looking and praying for steady, *moderate* rainfall!

There are many moving pieces in the puzzle these days. More challenges than we wish to admit, yet we are looking for positive ways forward. There are possibilities of lunch programs and school gardens in nearby schools, more collaboration with neighboring hospitals, and invitations to many hospitals outside of Tanzania who long to have teaching and support to expand and improve the care in their NICUs. Many possible directions, many open doors! We are once again so grateful to have your partnership on this journey here in Tanzania.
