Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

The disciples feared for a day when Jesus might no longer walk with them. Never fear. Jesus promised an Advocate to remain with them forever.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

- When have you needed an advocate? When have you needed to advocate for another?
