FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes – June 5, 2023 (not yet approved)

Members present: Pastor Denise Fossen, Kristi Ehrenberg (president), Marilyn Chindvall (vice president) and Lay Ministry, Becky Parker (treasurer) and Stewardship, Gayla Athey-Youth & Family, Marla Strei -Evangelism, Kaitlyn Burdorf-Christian Education, Glenn Henningson-Church Properties, and Barbara Wegner-Secretary.

Meeting was called to order by President Kristi Ehrenberg at 7:54 pm.

Approval of May Minutes. Becky & Kaitlyn MSP.

Approval of May Treasurer's Report - We didn't take from the operating reserve in May, but monthly offerings were down compared to May of last year. Cumulatively we're ahead of last year's general offering. Marla & Glenn MSP.

Board of Lay Ministry — Marilyn Chindvall – WAM didn't meet. June 18th Pastor Denise will be gone, Marilyn Hanson will lead service and Pastor Renee will preach by Zoom. Instead of contemporary service we will have a favorite hymn sing. The Endowment & Finance committees didn't meet, so there were no minutes to approve. Marilyn hasn't gathered members for the safety committee yet, but she did get a copy of the safety procedure from Bethlehem Lutheran Church in St. Cloud. It addresses fire, evacuation, severe weather, containment, shelter-in-place, and lockdowns. This will be a good starting place for discussion when the safety committee is put together.

As for the question of livestreaming the funeral, the board of Lay Ministry feels that Marina should be compensated if she's doing extra work & Mundwiler charges. She is sometimes compensated by our recommended amount for an honorarium that Mundwiler tells the families about. Kristi mentioned it's not extra time or work for Marina. She's also being compensated for her hours by FELC. Lay Ministry felt 2 weeks was long enough for the video to be on our Facebook page. Marla & Katilyn thought 30 days would be a fair time. There was discussion about limiting it to just members and how that creates a grey area and would be awkward and/or offensive to provide it based on membership. It was discussed that some people might not want their funerals to be livestreamed and it was asked if we could livestream on our website rather than Facebook. Though perhaps possible, it seems like it would be difficult to put it on our website without livestreaming on FB. Becky mentioned we wouldn't want the liability that comes with charging if technical errors could happen. Council clarified that livestreaming would be a voluntary service, only available if people specifically ask, with no additional fees and no ties to membership. The videos will be removed from FB 30 days after the service.

Board of Lay Ministry approved Barbara's summertime hours. She said summer has slowed down work a bit & talked with Pastor about the best times. She will work 6 hours less a week: Monday 8-3, Tuesday 8-noon, Wednesday 8-noon, Thursday 8-3, and Friday 8-noon. Pastor Denise will be around in the afternoons Monday and Tuesday, and sometimes on Wednesday. But she does pastoral care when she can on Wednesdays and Thursdays. There is a sign on the door with office hours, and there will be a message on it giving Pastor Denise's cell number in case of pastoral emergencies. As for the by-law changes for the endowment committee, the board of Lay Ministry did not want to approve it before the Endowment committee had a chance to look it over. The Endowment committee should approve it, then Lay Ministry. Because the endowment committee doesn't meet until July, we will move the by-law change to the January meeting.

Board of Evangelism – Marla Strei – Evangelism wanted to note that Marilee Haukos & Deb Henningson should be added to the election agenda as they are leaving and Marge Dragseth should be added to the ballot as she's willing to serve on Evangelism. No one can attend the Synod Assembly. The date of September 10th for God's Work Our Hands is fine. The Fairway View Hymn Sing will be June 14th at 4:00 pm, led by Marla Strei, and musically accompanied by Lisa Berdan. The Hymn Sing will be patriotically themed as it is Flag Day. The next hymn sings will be July 12th at 4 where Marilyn Hanson will accompany, and August 9th at 4 with Amy Adelman accompanying. Mission Emphasis Sunday is tentatively set for Sunday, November 12th or 19th and discussion was held about possible topics. There were no transfers in or out. Directory planning will be looked at in the fall. Evangelism felt the funeral videos should be available to all and removed after 30 days and that the Endowment committee should approve the by-law change first. Lastly, a special thank you to Kim Anderson for the instructional book for hosting the broadcasts at Fairway View. This is a helpful tool. Thank you, Kim!

Christian Education – Kaitlyn Burdorf – No one can attend the Synod assembly. Concerning vBS there are volunteers, but more will likely be needed. Sunday School (SS) was great this year and attendance didn't lessen much after Christmas. Christian Ed. enjoyed singing with the senior choir and performing at the nursing home, both of which they would love to do again. They will plan next year's SS lessons at their next meeting. August 27th is the suggested date for Backpack Blessing. Ortonville school starts Aug. 28th. The board considered September 17th for Rally Sunday. The board is open for dates for the confirmation reviews and were thinking that bible presentation should be after Rally Sunday, so possibly September 24th. They will figure out how many bibles are needed & let the office know to order them. Pastor Denise asked if VBS will do the Sunday Worship on July 23rd. Carmen has been talking with Green Lake about this & Kaitlyn wasn't sure. Sara Wollschlager will be added to their ballot.

Youth & Family – Gayla Athey – Adopt-a-highway ditch walk went well and the board voted to continue this service project. Minister Jim from Holden (Beardsley) and Trinity (Clinton) came to discuss the prospect of some type of cooperative youth ministry and leader. Kristi discussed our Youth Director job postings, hours, and what our budget is. The meeting went well. There are 18 kids going to summer camp. There is an ELCA youth gathering next summer in New Orleans. There are no plans for a mission trip right now. There are no additions to the ballot.

Stewardship – Becky Parker – Julie wrote a blurb for the bulletin about consistent giving for the summer and we will have that this week and Becky will give a short Temple Talk. Stewardship is fine with September 10th for God's Work Our Hands. The board is full and no one's term is ending. According to the by-laws of the congregation we shouldn't have authorized the spending of \$56,000 for the roof since it was not budgeted. It should have gone before the congregation. Stewardship Board makes a recommendation to disperse funds from either Minnwest Checking and/or the Ameriprise Investment Fund to pay for the roofing in the estimated amount of \$56,000. We haven't received a bill yet and have been instructed not to pay it. The board suggests leaving the decision of where the funds come from to the finance committee. Kristi mentioned we had a time constraint in making this decision to roof because they were going to be doing the half that was covered by insurance soon. This recommendation will go to the congregation at the annual election meeting on June 25th. Kristi read from a note from Art saying shingling is totally done, however the heat tape has to be re-done and the cross on the bell tower has to be reinstalled so we're not going to pay the bill until we know those items are done.

Approval of Stewardship's recommendation being added to the Annual Election Agenda. Marla & Gayla MSP.

Church Properties – Glenn Henningson – Dean wasn't here so there were no notes from Dean. The water fountain will cost about \$3,000 to fix. There was discussion on if it had to go to the congregation if it wasn't budgeted, but it should count under "Maintenance & repair." A suggestion was made to ask the Endowment committee for funds to cover this. To repair the sidewalk and sinkhole, we were given an estimate of \$8,800. Glenn didn't see any deterioration in the sidewalk problems. Both repairs together would eat up the repair budget of \$11,000. No one seems to be bothered by the sidewalk and it's marked well which is our responsibility to do. We will keep monitoring the sidewalk issues. There is a desire for the water fountain to be fixed before Vacation Bible School, so that will be a priority and Glenn will ask the Endowment committee for funds for capital improvement to help cover it. It may be a bad time to work on the sidewalk because the construction work has been shaking the building. The tile work in the Altar Guild & Storage rooms is done. Prior to the meeting, it was reported that Dale Price & Glenn Berdan should be placed on the ballot for this board.

PASTOR'S REPORT – Worship: During the summer, WAM selected setting four to be used. Weekly creation of visuals for children's message and sermon are completed and emailed to Marina to use during the service. We had in-person worship every Sunday in May at FELC, in person live at Fairway View May 7th and June 4th, and using computer to play the service at Fairway View on May 14th. Barbara showed me the book Kim Anderson put together for FVW; she did a nice job. Pastoral care: Richard Anderson's funeral on May 9th. Ann Lundberg's private burial May 26th. In the planning stages for a memorial service for Ken Henneberg which will be June 29th. Weekly bible study continues Tuesdays at Fairway View. When I've been unable to lead it, the parish nurses or others have led the study from a leader's guide I put together for them. Pastoral care continues in person, by phone or text, or mailed cards. May was a busy month with hospitalizations and an assortment of pastoral care concerns. Confirmation: The 7-8th graders had their last class on May 10th. The 9th graders had their last class on May 24th. They are working on finishing up their year-end test, missed lessons because of absences, and their final faith statement/creed. Some of them are working on their worship notes, too. I'll be meeting individually with those not having everything completed to date. Synod: I've been watching videos and reading reports in preparation for the SW MN Synod annual assembly June 9-10th. Part of the business meeting is the recognition and appreciation of ordained pastor's and their ministries. I will be recognized for ten years of ordained ministry. Miscellaneous: The week of May 15th I was in Minneapolis for continuing education. I enjoyed worship, preaching, and lectures. Minister Jim from Trinity in Clinton met and discussed sharing youth leadership opportunities and covering for each other's vacations. I did a near-death visit on Mother's Day night. Upcoming: I'll be on vacation Tuesday, June 13th through Monday June 19th. Minister Jim Rach from Trinity in Clinton will be available for emergency pastoral care.

Glenn said there was \$5,000 dollars in the bell fund so he will get it looked at by Chuck after the road opens. Becky asked about last-minute registration for the Synod assembly but the registration deadline had passed.

Next council meeting will be on August 7th at 7:00 PM Motion to adjourn – Marla & Glenn MSP. Closed with Lord's Prayer at 8:44 pm.

Larry Helgeson sent flowers to First English on June 25th. This was his message to you all:

Please accept the gladiole bouquet of flowers as a token of appreciation for the prayers and the cards from Day of Love these past 4 ½ years. June 25, 2023 is the fourth anniversary of my bone marrow transplant (aka stem cell transplant.) The chemotherapy treatment for multiple myeloma did not end with the transplant. My maintenance chemotherapy has me taking chemo pills for 21 days each month followed by 7 days off. I also receive two other chemo drugs by infusion once a month plus a drug to boost my immune system.

Your prayers and this chemotherapy regimen has made the cancer cells undetectable in my latest blood tests and my last bone marrow biopsy. Thank you!

Open Your Heart Summer Challenge

While children are out of school for the summer, many families struggle to increase their food budgets to ensure they have enough food to feed themselves and their family members. Due to pandemic relief programs that have expired and the inflation we are experiencing, households are faced with not having enough to eat. The Prairie Five/Big Stone Lake Area Food Shelf saw a 66.7% rise in household visits from 2021 to 2022 and we continue to stand ready to meet the rising need in our community. To help us ensure our community members have the food resources they need,

we are participating in the Open Your Heart (OYH) Summer Challenge. Open Your Heart helps fund solutions to end hunger and homelessness in Minnesota. Our goal this month is to raise \$5,000.







SW MN SYNOD ASSEMBLY

The Southwestern Minnesota Synod Assembly was held June 9-10 at Gustavus Adolphus College, St Peter. Our Pastor Denise was one of those attending this assembly. The theme of the Assembly was, "Embody the Word," which was present throughout the weekend. The Assembly was able to see the many gifts of leaders, both lay and rostered, from around the synod showcased in videos, worship, workshops, speakers, and around your tables.

The Assembly received reports and learned about our many ministry partner organizations. They welcomed ELCA staff member Rev. Kevin Jacobson, Director for Global Personnel, who provided a churchwide update and met with the Companion Synod Committee on their partnership with their Companion Synod in southern Africa. Their speaker, researcher Matt Bloom, lifted up factors that contribute to well-being and resiliency, particularly in the relationships and culture of churches and their leaders. Business included electing new governance leaders, approving constitutional changes, and adopting the budget for fiscal year 2025 and recommended compensation guidelines for 2024. They celebrated anniversaries and retirements and gave thanks for the life and ministry of pastors who have joined the heavenly chorus. And worship included singing hymns led by organ and Dakota Road, as well as a new evening prayer liturgy.

NICU - PEDIATRIC News

We continue to remain busy, with pediatrics at Selian Lutheran Hospital and ALMC. Established NICUs at both hospitals often run a combined daily census of 30+ babies, many of whom are born weighing less than 2 lbs. The work of our 11 Tanzanian doctors and 30+ NICU nurses inspire me, and sometimes I forget how far we've come over the past 10 years. Achieving high survival rates and seeing healthy infants and toddlers come back with their mothers to visit us and say "thank you" (see below) offers a deep, soul-filling joy to members of our team, who work long hours in a hospital facing monumental challenges that cannot be easily put into writing.

Last month we were able to send 2 Tanzanian doctors to University of Minnesota for 6 weeks, to attend a Global Health Course and see how pediatrics is conducted in Minneapolis-St Paul. We look forward to their return this week to Tanzania, and their newfound enthusiasm for Global Pediatrics.

In October we will be hosting our 3rd annual "Advancing Care of Critically III and Premature Babies in Africa" conference in Arusha. The scope of this 5-day training conference has grown dramatically, as speakers and attendees arrive from across the African continent, Europe and North America. It has become one of the largest clinical neonatology conferences offered in East Africa.

Water is Everything

It is a common saying in Tanzania: Water is Everything. Since my last "weather report", the rains did arrive and we are so thankful. As you know, weather is linked to the nutritional status of the communities and food insecurity is one of our biggest challenges in addressing malnutrition.

The childhood malnutrition that we have been treating through an inpatient program at Selian Hospital has been humming along as well and we have 20+ children coming through the program every month. We also have
