# July 23, 2023, Eighth Sunday after Pentecost Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43

Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



**Pray:** Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

God of the harvest, we are, each of us, at times wheat and at times weeds. Nourish us in word and sacrament that we might grow in the way you would have us, trusting in your abundant grace and mercy for all that you have created. In Jesus name we pray. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

"The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!" (Matthew 13:41-43)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

The kingdom of God is vast and welcoming and valuable. There is room for us here, whether we are wheat or weeds.



**Connect:** Connect in conversation with others in your household.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

What does it mean that the kingdom of heaven is a reaping of "good seed" and "weeds"? Which are you? How do you know? Whose job is it to discern good from bad, and to reap?

How can you grow like the "good seeds" in Jesus' parable? How might you make room in your life for others to grow alongside you?

For the littles: What does God's kingdom of heaven look like? What will you find there? One day you will live there!



**Bless:** Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God help you grow in faith and understanding. Amen.



**Do:** By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Buy or grow a bonsai tree. As you tend it, remember Jesus' parable, and the promise that God's kingdom of heaven is ready for you.



**Go Deeper:** Read and reflect on the readings for each day of the week.
