

Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

Gracious God, your Son spoke to us in parables about the nature of your reign. Give us ears to hear and hearts to understand that we might be instruments of your peace and justice. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

³³He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened." (Matthew 13:33)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

Jesus often taught using parables. We can enter into those parables with varying experiences of understanding. We can peek at glimpses of what the kingdom of heaven may be like as we listen.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

What do you think the kingdom of heaven is like? Is God's kingdom here on earth or up in heaven? Or both?

For the littles: Have you ever made bread? What does yeast do?



Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God's love be found throughout the dough of your life. Amen.



Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.
