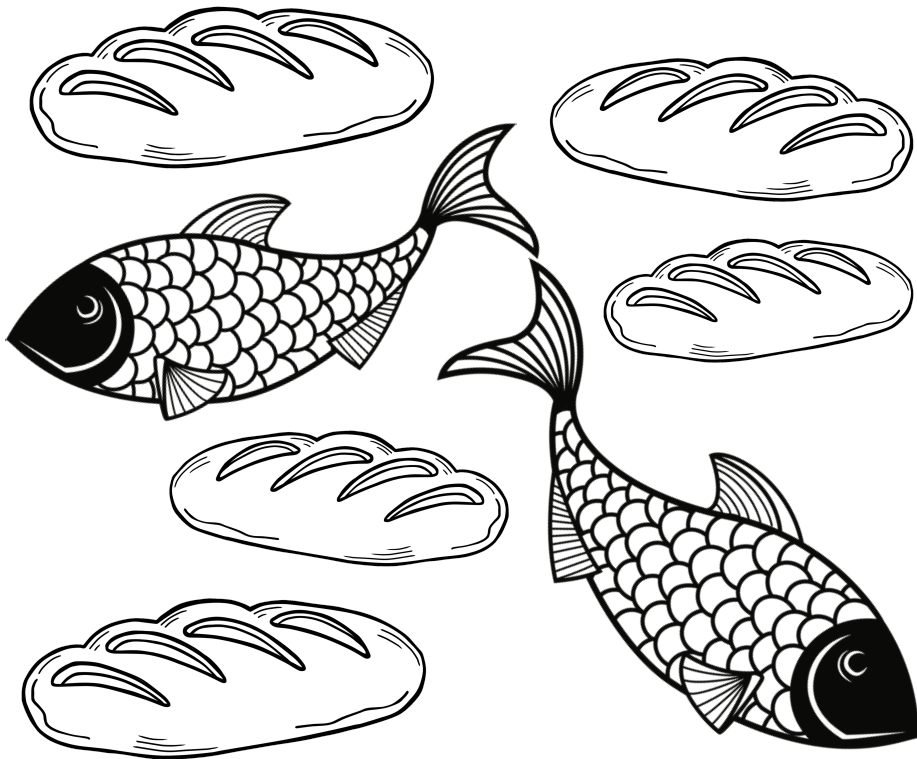


Draw & Color

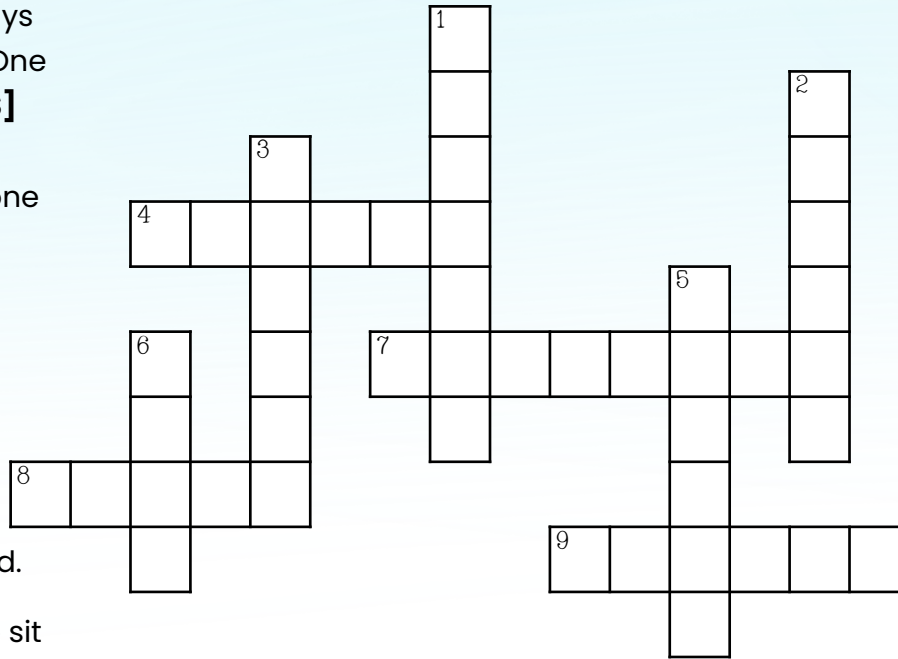
Andrew said, "This boy has five **[3 DOWN]** of bread and two **[6 DOWN]**."
