Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

God of wind and water, like the disciples we often find ourselves tossed about by life's challenges and wondering where you are. Remind us that you will always meet us in our distress, and your love will calm the storms in our hearts. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." (Matthew 14:26-27)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

The disciples are struggling with the wind, the boat, and their fear at seeing their teacher walking on the water like a ghost. Jesus' presence restores their faith and calms the storms within and without.

For the littles: What are you scared of? Who or what makes you feel brave?

May God grant you courage. Amen.



Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Consider something you have been putting off doing because you are afraid. Pray for the courage to do it. Take one step (or more!) this week to move toward and through the fear.
