From the Pastor



Becoming real.

I have not yet seen the Barbie movie (it's on my list). I'm told it's not really a movie about a toy; it's about becoming real. Barbie wants the same thing the Velveteen Rabbit wanted, what Pinocchio wanted, and what many of us want: to become real. We want to be "fully alive."



As Christians, we become real together, not alone. There are no Lone Ranger Christians. We become real in Christ. We become one with Christ each time we participate in the Lord's Supper. Some traditions use adapted words of St. Augustine to invite people to Communion, "Behold what you are." The people respond, "May we become what we receive."

Becoming fully real in Christ is what we do over a lifetime of faith. Some have found it helpful to have a "Rule of Life." Jenn Giles Kemper of Sacred Ordinary Days describes it this way:

"A rule of life is a commitment to live your life in a particular way. It is meant to be crafted with prayer and discernment, in partnership with God, as you consider the way God made you and the values He has inscribed upon your heart. Once written, it serves as a tool that can help you make decisions for your life and determine how best to order your days.

The first example of a Christian rule of life came from the Desert Fathers, a monastic community of mystics living in Egypt around the third century AD. The most well-known rule is the rule of St. Benedict, written fifteen hundred years ago, which was created to help his community of monks translate their faith into the habits and rhythms of their shared daily life.

A rule of life is different than the goals, intentions, or resolutions we tend to set for ourselves. Those methods are task-based and measurable, and they're often focused on what we do. A rule of life, on the other hand, helps you become. It is comprised of several simple statements that guide the posture of your life and the living of your days. It is not lived *perfectly* but can be lived *faithfully* while fostering within you an integrated and embodied life of faith.

Allow your rule to develop slowly over time. Listen for God and realize that the unique expression of Christ in you, your family, and your church will look different than the expression of Christ in others. It can be helpful to remember that the kingdom is built by the whole of the church body, so you need only seek to be a faithful hand or foot. Ask God how to live your part faithfully.

Consider inviting others into this exercise with you, such as a spouse, a spiritual director, or members of your community. Regard your rule as a living document—something you can review and adjust as you live it out."

As we begin our fall and school schedules, what better time to renew or begin a spiritual practice that helps us become real?

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes – August 7, 2023 (not yet approved)

Members present: Pastor Denise Fossen, Kristi Ehrenberg (president), Becky Parker (treasurer) and Stewardship, Darin Ehrenberg- Stewardship, Gayla Athey-Youth & Family, Kim Anderson -Evangelism, Michelle Bauer- Lay Ministry, Glenn Henningson-Church Properties, and Barbara Wegner-Secretary.

Meeting was called to order by President Kristi Ehrenberg at 7:53 pm.

Approval of June Minutes. Darin & Glenn MSP.

Approval of June Treasurer's Report – We're ahead by about \$8,300 in offerings this year to date compared to last year. We took \$10k out to cover expenses in June but didn't take money out in July. Offerings from 1st week in Aug. were good. ELCA Benevolence was lowered to 4%, when we bring in more, we can consider raising that some. Kim & Gayla MSP.

Board of Lay Ministry – Michelle Bauer – Accepted the June & July reports, except there was a question on the WAM minutes. The board wondered if there were three services on Christmas Eve. Pastor Denise explained that we don't know yet. Christmas Eve is the 4th Sunday in Advent. WAM still needs to meet to discuss plans. That answer was accepted. Marilyn Chindvall is still working on the safety committee. Trinity Lutheran in Clinton declined partnering due to an unexpected expense. The board does not feel from the discussions with Rebecca Larson that partnering her would be a good fit. The board wishes to go back to the drawing board on the youth director issue.

Board of Evangelism – Kim Anderson – Hymn Sings at Fairway View have been well attended and enjoyed. Our church members come and bring family members too. This Wednesday (8/9) is our last Hymn Sing this summer. Accepted the transfer in and out of Wally Sayles. The board will participate in the confirmation interviews on Aug. 23rd. They are planning for New Member Sunday for Sept. 17th. We do not know the number of new members at this time. Notices will be put in the bulletin so if someone is visiting, they can see a contact number and plan to come September 17th. The board is still looking into directory planning and hope to bring more information to the council at our September meeting. Kim asked about the financial impact of the directory that we'd be looking at and where those monies would come from. It's been 5 years since our last one. Becky said we would have to look back at what it would cost. Pastor Denise added that if anyone knows some new people who have been regularly attending church, please invite these new members to join.

Christian Education – No one from the Board of Christian Ed was present.

Youth & Family – Gayla Athey – Kari wasn't here. Gayla didn't want to pick a chair without all 2 members present. The contact information is correct. The Board began with Lay Ministry to discuss the Youth Leader prospects. Trinity had an unexpected expense so we won't be partnering with them so the board is going back to the drawing board and will meet in the next few weeks to try to figure something out for Kid's Club and Youth Group. Zion is not a good fit for us. Kari & Gayla have not discussed the ELCA Youth gathering, covenant night, or Synod Junior High Gathering yet.

Stewardship – Darin Ehrenberg – We're behind on total receipts but the offerings have been up since last year. Board rotates representatives so no chair was picked. Contact info is right. Job descriptions are right. Darin needs safe haven training but no one else from the board does. The dates for the backpack blessing, God's Work Our Hands, New Member Sunday, Rally Sunday and Bible Presentation are fine. Board is waiting for Pastor & WAM to choose a theme for the next year so they can decide on a stewardship theme. Vacation Bible School was really well received. Everyone loved it but there was discussion on the expense (\$100+ per kid). Board believes that VBS involves outreach to non-members, so in the future pink-envelope or Lent offerings may be designated to help pay for VBS. Marge Dragseth volunteered to house the VBS councilors again. It worked out well to have them all in one house. At least 40 of the 49 children were members or grandchildren of members. Marge says it preps kids and gets them excited about going to camp also. Having it here brought more kids. Families seemed to enjoy having it here more than having it elsewhere. Having it more than one day was great and having them come to the service on Sunday and sing brought it all together.

Church Properties – Glenn Henningson – Art came and discussed Nobles has some more work to do. We still owe them about \$97,000 and haven't paid them yet. We will sit on that until it's done. No items from Dean, except the carpets are going to be shampooed later this week. The board will continue to work on getting the bells fixed.

PASTOR'S REPORT - Pastor Denise -

Worship: As the norm, "live" services are held the 1st Sunday of the month at Fairway View with communion; the 2nd Sunday they watch on the screen and are served communion. July 31st was the fifth Sunday and was by watching on the screen. A seven-week Advent series was purchased. WAM and I will discuss it when we meet in September. Also to be discussed are what services are to be held and when as December 24th is the fourth Sunday in Advent and Christmas Eve. The theme verse and contemporary service order of worship are a work in progress, as is Gods Work Our Hands' Sunday. The Blessing of the Backpacks' blessing and prayer are completed.

Pastoral Care: Funerals: Swede Anderson, with Rev. Daryl Thul officiating on June 16th; Mark Block, with Rev. Melanie Reiners officiating on June 23rd; Wally Sayles visitation and funeral (June 27th) and Ken Henneberg (June 29th) with me officiating. Weekly bible study at Fairway View which is down to 3 people. We'll see if more people start coming again in fall. Completed pre-marital counseling for the Mork-Thorson wedding. Pastoral care was given by phone, in-person in my office, in their home, in hospital, on their death bed, and by mail.

Youth and Confirmation: VBS was July 24-27th. I was there daily. There was a lot of singing and a lot of energy. VBS sang their songs at a program Thursday night and on Sunday July 30th. Thanks to all the volunteers that assisted the Green Lake Bible Camp counselors for a successful and fun-filled event.

Confirmation has been planned for the 2023-2024 school year. This year we'll be meeting during Lent, with a meal organized by Marge Dragseth (open to everyone), followed by the mid-week Lenten service. The younger confirmation students will help with set-up and serving.

Confirmation interviews will be held on August 23rd with August 30th for acolyte training and confirmation orientation for parents and students. First day of confirmation class is September 6th.

Backpack blessings to be held during the service on August 27th and September 24th is bible distribution.

I had a conversation with Rebecca Larson, the youth director at Zion Lutheran in Ortonville, about the possibility of some cooperative youth work.

Synod and Community: I was a participant (reading the "charges") at the ordination of Laurel "Mort" Meyenberg at Our Saviors Lutheran in Montevideo on Saturday, July 22nd.

Pastor Janet Warnes from Zion Lutheran Church in Ortonville has resigned her position. I was in contact with the synod office to clarify what our/my responsibilities are. Zion is to reach out if they need anything.

Hymn sings were held at Fairway View on the second Wednesday of June-July-August.

Looking Ahead: God's Work Our Hands is Sunday September 10th.

Kristi asked who has organized God's Work Our Hands in the last years. Kirsten Karels was mentioned, along with Michelle Bauer saying she has done it. Nancie's name was also mentioned as having worked on it in the past.

New member Sunday is September 17th (same day as Rally Sunday). I've spoken with two families that are interested in formally joining. If you know of others that are regular attenders and would like to formally join our church, have them contact me or the church office.

October has a baptism, wedding, and confirmation on three different weekends.

The Bishop's Fall Theological gathering for rostered leaders is October 8-10th in Sioux Falls, SD. I will be leaving after church Sunday afternoon and returning Tuesday late afternoon, but I'm not sure if I'll be back in time for Bible study at Fairway View or not.

December 2, 2023 is Equipping Congregations Day; details forthcoming. June 7-8, 2024 is Synod Assembly.

Final Notes & Comments: Becky appreciated that Sunday morning hymns have been extremely relevant to the scriptures for the day. Kristi asked if Kathy is supposed to come during recorded services (as some of the people at Fairway View were expecting her). Kathy comes during the live services, not the pre-recorded ones. Becky also mentioned the directions (with screenshots) for the volunteers who go to Fairway View are excellent. The new directions from Kim Anderson have been very helpful for our volunteers.

• Board of Evangelism - Contact information is good. Marge Dragseth will be the board chair.

Next council meeting will be on September 11th at 7:00 PM. Motion to adjourn – Becky & Darin MSP. Closed with Lord's Prayer at 8:19 pm.

Adonai- Lord and Master

Adonai is a Hebrew name for God meaning "master, ruler, owner, lord." It is the generic term for "lord" in Hebrew. It is first seen in Scripture when Abram, longing for an heir, cries out to God in Genesis 15:2. He looked to him in prayer through confusing circumstances. He connected his hopes to Adonai and revered Him as the one who held answers to life in His hands.







The 39th Annual Quilt Auction was another record-breaking year! It was a beautiful, sunny day at camp and the perfect day for a Quilt Auction! Over 120 bidders joined us under the tent, while an additional 200 people bid online. This year's Moment of Giving raised funds to repair the Stave Chapel at Green Lake Bible Camp, totaling over \$42,000. The Quit Auction itself raised over \$153,000! This year's auction and Moment of Giving totals not only broke the previous records, which were set just last year, but also helped to surpass the \$2,000,000 mark for total funds raised at the Quilt Auction historically.
