

C: God is at work in us!

P: In our service today, and in our daily lives, let us live out what God has called us to in baptism.

C: God is at work through our hands!

P: God bless your hands and your work, Signing a cross on the palms of the hands:

Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



**Pray:** Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

God of community, wherever two or three are gathered in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ, we know that you, Triune God, Three-in-One, are in the midst of them. As we gather together today, fill us with the awareness of your presence within and around us. Amen.



**Read:** Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

"Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

(Matthew 18:19-20)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

Jesus offers some practical advice to the early Christian community, and reminds them that he is in their midst whether they are in disagreement or agreement with one another.

For the littles: Who are your favorite people? When do you get to see them all at the same time?



**Bless:** Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God gather you and bless your endeavors. Amen.



**Do:** By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Invite a small group of like-minded people to coffee or lunch. Set an intention to accomplish a goal. Pray for God's guidance before you begin.
