Our theme verse for the 2023-2024 year is based on Psalm 139:14. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well.

In other words, "created to be..."

This verse is based on the church wide ELCA youth gathering July 16-20, 2024, held in New Orleans, Louisiana. A verse that reminds us of who we are, whose we are, and what we are created to be. We already have several students and parents interested in attending this exciting and encouraging event.

This theme is also the basis for our contemporary service, the third Sunday in the months of October, November, and January through May. In this Thanksgiving for Baptism service, we remember our new birth in baptism and will include new songs from the hymnal supplement "All Creation Sings" along with several Dakota Road favorites. You'll leave the service with a "pep in your step" as you go out into the world to love and serve your neighbor.

We look forward to Affirmation of Baptism (confirmation) on October 29th, Reformation Sunday. We have five students affirming their faith who will also help lead the worship service.

In other worship news, we will use a seven-week-long Advent series based on the theme "Out of Time." As we remember Jesus' first coming to prepare ourselves for his second arrival, we also are training to recognize the places where Christ is already appearing in the world.

This series invites reflection on how people experience time and how God uses our experience to meet us, challenge us, bless us, shape us, and call us into holy endings and new beginnings. We'll begin the extended Advent on November 12th, the Sunday after All Saints Sunday, and keep this theme through Sunday morning on the December 24th service at the regular 9:00 am time. WAM (worship arts music) is already working on creating visuals for this theme including a large clock, a supplemental table, and candles for seven weeks of candle lighting, and more.

There is much excitement for the upcoming fall and winter worship experiences in the music and arts ministries of this church. We all look forward to the Spirit's work in aiding you to hear the gospel, the Good News of Jesus Christ, in a new way, through music, the Word of God through scripture and sermons, visuals, and prayers. We look forward to seeing how "created to be..." comes alive in each one of you.

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes – September 11, 2023 (not yet approved)

Members present: Pastor Denise Fossen, Kristi Ehrenberg (president), Becky Parker (treasurer) and Stewardship, Darin Ehrenberg- Stewardship, Kaitlyn Burdorf - Christian Ed, Kari Dorry- Youth & Family, Kim Anderson - Evangelism, Marilyn Chindvall- Lay Ministry, Glenn Henningson-Church Properties, and Barbara Wegner-Secretary.

Meeting was called to order by President Kristi Ehrenberg at 7:51 pm.

Approval of August Minutes. Becky & Glenn MSP.

Approval of August Treasurer's Report – We didn't take money out of operating reserves last month. We're ahead cumulatively compared to last year. Our expenses are down because we're not paying a youth director and we've lowered what we give the synod. \$97,000 of our \$107,000 in Capital Improvement is owed to Noble Roofing. Darin, Kari **MSP**.

Board of Lay Ministry – Marilyn Chindvall – Board needed clarification from Pastor about advent. The board approved the WAM minutes once they understood them. Our advent season is usually 4 weeks, but it will be 7 weeks this year with a focus on the theme of running out of time. We will have an Advent morning service Christmas Eve at 9 am, and then our normal Christmas Eve services at 2 and 4 pm. We had a suggestion from someone about our acolyte robes being updated to linen-type which would cost about \$100/robe and we would need seven different sizes. The board decided it was not the best allocation of our resources at this time. There will be an interview with a possible youth director on Wednesday at 2:15 pm. The Safety booklet is done, and the board thought it would be good to have them in the pews. The board would like Sheriff Brown (and hopefully many ushers) to come on a Sunday

and talk about the safety procedures. Staff interviews will be in October. The next Pastor-Parish meeting will be October 23 at 3:00 pm. The Christmas Tree will go up after Thanksgiving, regardless of our Advent services starting early. The youth director applicant applied before we split the youth position up. All possible position options will be discussed at the interview.

Board of Evangelism - Kim Anderson - The board recommends transferring Ryan, Amanda, and Winnie Stattelman and John & Lila Salls in as new members on September 17th, 2023. We will have a short introduction to them during our Sunday morning service. The introduction will not be after service because Sara, one of the sponsors, is involved in Rally Sunday and Ryan, Amanda, and Winnie will also be involved in Rally Sunday too. This way the whole church membership will meet the new members, rather than just those who go to the coffee fellowship after service. The board also recommends that Mason Block, Rylie Conroy, Archer Dorry, Mikaela Johnson, and Ashton Sletten be confirmed on October 29, 2023. Directory planning went back into organizing mode. Marla and Barbara have been working on that. Barbara found an online directory that should allow us to take our own photos in the church with an iPhone, and those photos will get placed into the online directory for about \$100 a year. We would have a physical photo directory printed with Heritage to give to those who don't want to look it up online. It would be set up in a similar way to our past photo directories, with staff pictures in front and people can submit their own photos. The board would like to give a temple talk on September 24th and October 1st to say the church directory will be ramping up again and you won't be asked to buy a photo because it's simply members of this church taking them. The photos are going to a secure website which requires a password. The whole world will not be able to see what's in our directory. Just for the Love of it: there are two other meals being held in October. November and December become busy. January seems quiet & people may need to have a come together time. If the weather's bad, we just postpone it. Christian Education - Kaitlyn Burdorf - The board discussed the theme verse and will continue to consider how to incorporate it into Sunday School. Kaitlyn & Ashley will hand out bibles on 9/24. The board discussed the application for the youth leader position and Kid's Club and Youth Group. All board members have full-time jobs and cannot help with leading these groups. Sara will purchase The Sunday School Store's curriculum for this year. Carmen was going to come up with dates for the Sunday School to sing in worship. She was sick so she wasn't at the meeting. The Christmas Program has been moved up to December 10th this year. The board was wondering if they are supposed to buy the confirmands gifts. It was discussed that there were gifts of the confirmand's verse (in a frame) given in the past. Kristi thought Liz had the template for it. Rally Sunday will be a normal Sunday School at the church. Youth & Family - Kari Dorry - Safe Haven and Background checks will be online and are being taken care of by Liz. The Youth Gathering is coming up next summer. Kari will chair, Kelsey and Kirsten said they would be on that committee. Liz will help in the background and was able to figure out the point system. There will be a meeting soon to figure out how much that will cost. Pastor Denise mentioned to discuss the question, "Do we want confirmation-age students who are not participating in our confirmation classes to be a part of the Youth Gathering?" There is also a Junior High Youth Gathering November 17-18th. The board asked Liz to post to see if anyone is interested in going and if there

Stewardship – Darin Ehrenberg – Because Advent is longer the board will do their temple talk on the 5th of November. A Stewardship letter has been created, with the theme verse on one side, and instructional information on the other. There is information in the letter about what active members do. After the October council meeting we plan on getting the letter printed and get envelopes with names on them and mail the remaining letters on November 6th. Year to date, we are over \$5,000 in giving and we didn't have to use our reserves. God's Work, Our Hands was well-attended and the potluck meal was also well-attended. The board of Stewardship believes that Vacation Bible School is a community outreach activity. Regardless of it costing us money, we raised almost half of that back. The board believes it is worth it regardless of the monetary cost. VBS helps children get excited to go to bible camp. It also is another form of evangelism when the kids go home and tell their parents what they did and learned. The board plans to designate the Lenten offering to Vacation Bible School.

Church Properties - Glenn Henningson - The cross still needs fixing. Glenn Berdan may manufacture something for it. Dean will call Noble Roofing to patch it over for the winter, so we don't get ice damage. The heat tape will be replaced with new heat tape for the roof. Someone tried to look at the bells and was chased by hornets. He will look at them sometime later when hornets won't be around. Long-term needs like the tile, and painting still need to be done, but they are being put on the back burner due to lack of funds. The fire extinguishers were recently checked. PASTOR'S REPORT - Pastor Denise - Worship: We had our last hymn sing for the summer at Fairway View on August 9th. It was good to see people from our parish, besides the residents, attend. WAM met on August 27th after church. Discussed September through December worship services. Special services included Backpack Blessing on August 27th, God's Work Our Hands on September 10th, New Member and Rally Sunday September 17th. October brings a baptism on October 1st, wedding rehearsal October 6th and wedding October 7th, and Affirmation of Baptism on October 29th. With five students being confirmed, they will have their faith statements/creeds printed and on display in the narthex that day. The 2023-2024 verse is Psalm 139:14. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well. In other words, "We are created to be..." This is based on the 2024 National Youth Gathering theme. A contemporary service outline has been completed, using new songs from the All Creation Sings hymnal supplement and familiar Dakota Road songs. Our sending song is one that will leave you with a pep in your step as you go out into the world. Amy Adelman and I met to select September-October hymns.

We are using an extended Advent season beginning November 12th – December 24th with the theme, "Out of Time." WAM members are working on the visuals of additional Advent candles, etc. We will still acknowledge and celebrate All Saints Sunday November 5th and Christ the King on November 26th. Final details of these services are a work in progress. Youth and Confirmation: Confirmation interviews were held August 23rd and it's recommended that all five be confirmed October 29th. Acolyte training and confirmation orientation for parents and students was

on August 30th. We currently have registered fourteen 7th & 8th graders and four 9th graders. After last year's winter experience, we will be meeting on early out days and during Lent. Marge will coordinate meals after confirmation before service during Lent. We do not yet have a paid employee to run the after-school program and youth group for the 7-12th grade. Volunteers are needed to keep these important programs going. **Pastoral Care:** We had no baptisms nor funerals in August. Connections were made with parishioners and non-parishioners in person, by note, and by phone. Twice in August I had pastoral conversations with people unaffiliated with FELC in need of pastoral care. I attended the Big Stone County Mental Health meeting on August 30th with the focus on suicide prevention. I plan to attend the Ortonville Childcare Forum in Clinton on Wednesday evening after confirmation classes. **Synod and Community:** Kevin and I attended Zion Lutheran's pie and ice cream social. It was good to see so many in the community attending. The synod minister assigned to our area and conference, Rev. Naomi Mahler, has chosen hospice after her cancer returned. In the meantime, Synod Minister Rev. Heather Culuris or Executive Assistant Tammy Schacher will be available for inquiries.

FELC is hosting the Laq Qui Parle minister conference on September 21st. Ethel Swenson has agreed to coordinating people to serve coffee and a lunch.

The Bishop's Fall Theological Conference is scheduled for October 8-10th in Sioux Falls. I will be leaving Sunday, October 8th in the afternoon and returning October 10th in late afternoon.

The Junior High Youth Gathering is November 17-18th.

Next council meeting will be on October 2nd at 7:00 PM. Motion to adjourn – Kari, Kim **MSP**. Closed with Lord's Prayer at 8:25 pm.




