# HOLY BAPTISM

PROFESSION OF FAITH

(The minister addresses parents, sponsor, & congregation.)

P: Do you believe in the God the Father?

C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

C: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

P: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

C: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

P: The Lord be with you. C: And also with you.

P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

C: It I right to give our thanks and praise.

**WELCOME** 

A lighted candle may be given to each of the newly baptized as the congregation says:

C: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

P: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

C: We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

#### Matthew 22:15-22

Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



**Pray:** Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

God of all, we might scoff at the Pharisee's constant attempts to entrap Jesus, but how often do we ourselves seek to justify our actions or inactions through complex arguments or sneaky manipulations? Remind us that we cannot overcome your truth, and call us back into the way you would have us go. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

Then he said to them, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's." When they heard this, they were amazed; and they left him and went away. (Matthew 22:21b-22)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

The Pharisees sought to trap Jesus in an argument about taxes. Jesus responded in the only way he could: by putting the onus back on them.
