Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures:

'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is amazing in our eyes'?" (Matthew 21:42)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

The Pharisees were pressing Jesus but not hearing him. Perhaps they will see themselves in Jesus' parable about wicked tenants who killed for their own gain—even the landowner's own son!
