

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes – October 2, 2023 (not yet approved)

Members present: Pastor Denise Fossen, Kristi Ehrenberg (president), Becky Parker (treasurer) and Stewardship, Julie Schneider- Stewardship, Kayla Minder (née Teske) - Christian Ed, Gayla Athey- Youth & Family, Marge Dragseth - Evangelism, Marilyn Chindvall- Lay Ministry, Brent Zahrbock- Lay Ministry, Dale Price-Church Properties, and Barbara Wegner-Secretary.

Meeting was called to order by President Kristi Ehrenberg at 8:17 pm.

Approval of September Minutes. Julie & Kayla MSP.

Approval of August Treasurer's Report – It was a light month, but we didn't have to go through the reserves in Sept. The reason we have extra money is because cut the giving amount to the Synod in half. Brent, Marge **MSP**.

Board of Lay Ministry – Marilyn Chindvall – Accepted September WAM report. The board members were assigned to a staff member for October interviews. Accepted WAM's suggestion of the 7 o'clock Thanksgiving Eve Service time. Gayla is going off of the Endowment Committee and will need to be replaced. Dick Strei will be asked if he wants to serve another term. The board looked at WAM's suggestions for paying the choir director and pianists. The board will

look at that when discussing the budget for the staff. Effective January 1, 2024, Minnesota employers with one or more employees are required to provide paid earned sick and safe leave (ESSL) to all employees who work for the employer within the state at least 80 hours during the year. Employees accrue one hour of ESSL for every 30 hours worked up to 48 hours per year. This means our handbook will need to be updated as it applies to all of our employees, whether they're full or part-time or casual, fill-in, or salaried. We have to figure out what to do with our fill-in, casual, and part-time staff. No final decisions were made, the board mostly learned about the new law at this meeting. Whether or not the hours will carry over or can be paid out will have to be decided on at a later date. New employees are not allowed to use the ESSL until they've worked 80 hours in that year. We will have to keep track of hours in order to figure this out for each employee and it will be reported on their pay stub as well. The board is not ready to establish a transition team. The Synod knows and we will hear from Pastor Heather November 2nd. The board decided on 5 years for the external audit.

Board of Evangelism – Marge Dragseth – Marge motioned to transfer in Daniel Bartels, seconded by Becky. **Passed.** Evangelism held a couple temple talks and will start officially taking photos for the directory October 8th. Although a few ladies dressed up and wanted their pictures taken earlier than that. Barbara printed off the photo directory informational sheets that will be filled out by members. The board will pass them out this upcoming Sunday. The board didn't discuss Mission Emphasis Sunday.

Christian Education – Kayla Minder (née Teske) – To incorporate the theme into Christian Ed, the children will learn a song that the Praise team will sing on Contemporary services. So, they will sing with the Praise Team on November 19th and starting in February they will potentially sing once a month. Carmen is looking for a camp-style song that will fit the theme also. Christian Ed believes we can do the audit this year because who knows what our finances will look like in a year or two. Christian Ed says to hold off on kid's club and youth group until we get a youth director. The board believes we should still be advertising for a youth director. Kristi mentioned that Kaityln Burdorf is willing to have a more formal meeting concerning the position.

Youth & Family – Gayla Athey – The board thought we should wait 5 years for the external audit to save money. The board didn't vote to hire the last Youth Director applicant and suggested waiting until the new year to advertise the youth position. Liz is working on the safety training and background checks. There was a meeting on 9-24 to discuss the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans in summer of 2024. Kids need to be signed up by October 13th and then the board will nail down fundraising plans. Covenant night is on hold. The board plans to have the children meet for a Youth Night once a month with the Zion and Baptist church youth. The board is working on getting chaperones for the Synod Junior High Gathering in November in Willmar. Kelsey said she would be willing to go and will look for others.

Stewardship – Julie Schneider – Board stuffed Stewardship Drive envelopes and decided to do the temple talk on November 12th. Whatever envelopes aren't picked up on the 12th will be mailed out. Board suggested 5 years for the audit.

Church Properties – Dale Price – Becky Parker shared an update on the roofing bill. The south side of the roof was quoted to be almost \$42,000 so the insurance paid almost \$41,000 and the actual cost from Nobel ended up being \$30,655.10. Matt told Becky they screwed up on how they bid for the repair, so it was much less than expected. We're not with the same insurance company that paid this out. Brent said he wouldn't worry about them coming back later asking for a refund. Because of this, Becky made a motion to pay the bills for the north and south sides. We currently have the bill for the north side (\$54,432.36). And we should pay the south side bill when we receive it. The total would be \$85,087.46 which would save us approximately \$11,000. In Capital Improvement right now we have \$107,000. Dale seconded the motion to pay both bills. **Motion Passed.** Nelson Electric repaired the SS door exterior light and emergency lights. We still need to receive a final bid package for the water fountain that includes the electrical work. We are waiting for a good freeze so there won't be wasps or bees so we can get a better idea of what technically needs to be done to fix the bells. Then we will need a temple talk to help pay for it. The board wants to get the cross back up, but for this winter we need to cap what is up there, so we don't get snow and ice damage to the roof. There is an ongoing wish list for other projects. It's been about 20 years since the Sanctuary was painted. The fire extinguishers were taken care of last month. The heat tape is done. (A couple days after council Dean said that the heat tape and exit signs are not yet done). Someone will have to meet next month with Ronglien about snow removal for the winter months. Dean told the board we have raised concrete (on the front platform & sidewalk) that will need to be ground down because it's a safety hazard. It's been repaired before but it's shifting. There was no preference on the audit. The tech desk is sitting against the pews with open wires. We should cover those cords because it is a safety issue.

Kristi asked about the safety handbook. Marilyn said she would like us to have an informational meeting about the safety procedures, perhaps combining it with the children's fire drill. It would be good for the ushers to all be at this meeting. It would take place during coffee fellowship.

PASTOR'S REPORT – Pastor Denise – Worship – Communion services were September 3rd & 10th and October 1st. The first Sundays of the month I lead the service at Fairway View; the second Sunday is lay-led communion service. Rev. Rick Hoyme led the service on the 3rd as I recovered from a tooth extraction. We had a shortened service on September 10th for the God's Work Our Hands Sunday, a fantastic day of projects reaching out to our local and global communities. Thanks for all your hard work! September 17th, we welcomed two families as they joined our congregation. Three-year-olds and third graders received Bibles on the 24th. October will have a different service each Sunday: October 1st was baptism and Holy Communion; 8th will be Communion; 15th is contemporary; the 22nd Service of the Word; and 29th Affirmation of Baptism. Thanks to Barbara and the organists for their flexibility. November 5th is All Saints Sunday where we remember those saints that have died in the past year and remember the new saints that we welcomed through baptism. November 12th begins the extended Advent season.

Pastoral care - Baptism of David Bartels 10/1/23 during the morning church service. In the afternoon was the graveside service and burial for Howard Janssen.

September 5th Bible study at Fairway View was cancelled due to Covid; we met all other Tuesdays.

Youth - Confirmation classes started September 5th. We have fifteen 7-8th grade students and four 9th graders. We meet every Wednesday; except we will not have class on October 18th due to MEA.

Upcoming - Rachel Mork and Jordan Thorson wedding rehearsal and wedding (October 5-6). Bishop's Fall Theological event (required) in Sioux Falls begins the evening of October 8th and goes through early afternoon on the 10th.

The Lac Qui Parle conference meeting will be at Maynard Lutheran on October 26th. FELC hosted the September meeting. Thanks for the hospitality shown. At WAM's request, the Thanksgiving Eve service will have three people from the congregation share what they are grateful for. I'm grateful for Liz putting together a list of past Thanksgiving Talkers, so we can get new speakers this year.

Pastor Denise was excused from the council meeting for the night.

5 years for an external audit was decided as it had more support than the other options. We must have at least 1 audit a year, usually done with an in-house lay audit committee. The decision was on paying an external auditor.

The Church Council formalized the vote to accept Pastor Denise's second option for her resignation, which means she will be here for the whole of December, and we will pay her 2 extra weeks' vacation.

Next council meeting will be on November 6th at 7:00 PM.

YOUTH NEWS NOVEMBER 2023


Thank you to all the people that have provided snacks for Confirmation. The youth really appreciate the treats.

It's that time of year again when the leaves are changing colors... and the Tiny Feet, Big Steps 2023 neonatology conference is coming up! This is the 3rd annual conference we have hosted in Arusha and every year it grows. Our title this year no longer refers to advancing care in "Tanzania" or "East Africa". Rather, it is "Tiny Feet, Big Steps-- Advancing Care of Critically III and Premature Babies in Africa". We are excited to have ~100 hospitals joining us from 15 African countries October 23-27!

The past few months were spent in MN and GA as we took care of dental and medical appointments (Caedmon had a repeat knee surgery), visited friends and family, and had important time with grandparents while working remotely. Emails and text messages kept Steve especially busy though there were times to relax and unwind away from everyday work in the hospital and regain some balance. It was so good to be near the lakes, to walk, swim and play with family and be encouraged by many.

Now that we have returned, we are in full motion. It is challenging to stay in a place of peace when the world around us and the daily challenges we face feel daunting. As we work, we remember Psalm 90:17, "...establish the work of our hands. Yes, establish the work of our hands." Our hearts and spirits are encouraged by our favorite artist, Steve Bell, to work in the world with kindness. He sings of God's work through us in the world in this way:

Ours are the hands through which he works. Ours are the feet on which he moves. Ours are the voices through which he speaks to this world with kindness. Through our touch, our smile, our listening ear, embodied in us, Jesus in living here. Let us go now, enspirited into this world with kindness.

That is our heart, our prayer.

NICU Conference

If you like numbers (which I do!!), here are a few...

- 109 doctors and 128 nurses registered to attend, all of whom work in NICUs
- 100 hospitals
- 15 African and 2 Asian countries
- 5 full days of teaching (and 1 evening banquet!)
- 52 lectures and 24 skills workshops, covering everything from the neonatology basics (thermoregulation, respiratory support, growth and nutrition, sepsis) to complex topics (neonatal seizures, insertion of chest tubes, advanced resuscitation in babies, etc).
- Instructors coming from 23 institutions including speakers from South Africa, Botswana, Tanzania, Uganda and Kenya
- Special sessions on sharing difficult news to grieving parents and how to care for yourself after a death.

This conference has become the largest neonatology training conference hosted in East Africa. It has nearly doubled in size from our first conference in 2021. We are grateful for the sponsors and donors who helped us cover the \$100,000 budget, so that we could assist doctors and nurses in attending from across the continent.

Over the past years, I have had the great joy of working with some amazing Tanzanian doctors. Often discovered during their internship year, they have joined our team of pediatrics, and after a few years of mentorship are supported to go on for an additional 3 - 4 years of pediatric training outside of Tanzania.

All of these wonderful doctors are committed to returning to Arusha, and one day join our team of pediatricians! Nothing brings me more joy than mentoring them, and helping them pursue further training in pediatrics.

We would welcome your donation to help with the cost of the conference and the training of these pediatricians! The conference is subsidized through our Pediatric- NICU account to make it affordable for the nurses and doctors in the region. Some health care teams are sponsored by their hospitals, but many of them are not and would unable to attend a conference like this without considerable help. Care of hospitalized newborns and children, and training of doctors and nurses, is supported through your donations.


