



Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.




Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

"Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you." (Matthew 5:12)



On this day when we remember all the saints of Christ—those who have passed and all of us who live in Christ—we are reminded of the promise that our reward will be great in heaven, thus we are invited to rejoice and be glad here and now. **Connect:** Connect in conversation with others in your household.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

Who have you lost that still hurts? Who can you reach out to for support?

What are God's promises for us after death?

For the littles: Have you ever lost a loved one? How do you feel? It's ok to be sad when someone dies. It also ok to be ok.

Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God bless you and the saints before you. Amen.

Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.
