

From the President

## Greetings:

I hope that you and your families had a wonderful and blessed Christmas holiday. It was a joy to see so many in attendance for the Christmas Cantata at church and at the Abbey of the Hills. Our kids also did an amazing job for their Sunday School Christmas program. Thank you to all who gave of their time and talents to plan, help, and perform for these special Christmas events.

As we enter this next chapter of our Church following the retirement of Pastor Fossen, I wanted to share with all of you what has been done so far for securing coverage for our pastoral needs. The Council has been working with Pastor Heather Culuris from the ELCA SW MN Synod. She is our primary contact for the Pastoral call process. The Board decided and we've requested for the Synod to seek an interim Pastor candidate for our church. In the meantime, we'll continue the work needed to prepare and initiate the processes required for seeking full-time Pastor candidates. We, along with 30+ other congregations in our Synod region, are currently seeking pastors including our fellow congregation at Zion Lutheran here in Ortonville. So, it may be a lengthier process than we would hope.

Pastor Culuris recommended arranging for 8-weeks of coverage initially. The Board of Lay Ministry has been diligently working on securing coverage for the January and February services. As part of the plan, I met personally with Pastor David Tonn. Pastor Tonn expressed his desire to help our congregation in the ways that he felt were most appropriate for him relative to personal needs and other commitments. He asked that we not call upon him to preach for Sunday services, but instead to utilize him as needed for things such as presiding

over funerals and baptisms, being extra support for our Parish Nurses and congregants for visits and communion for our shut-in members, and things of that nature. He's willing to help us with these needs, as he's available, until we are able to secure either an interim or a full-time Pastor. I ask that our congregation be respectful of his wishes and limit our requests to these tasks and honor his retirement decision. Requests to utilize Pastor Tonn for these specific tasks must be submitted through Barbara at the Church office.

Beyond Pastor Tonn, the Board of Lay Ministry has been reaching out to rostered Pastors and Lay Leader from our Synod web site as well as the SD synod who are within reasonable driving distance. They've also been contacting some of our own talented Lay Leaders in our congregation who have expressed an interest in providing a sermon. Additionally, they have been reaching out to other people within our region who have provided lay support to other churches. They've been able to fill most of those initial spots and secured someone to lead our Lenten services. If there are others from our congregation with an interest in providing a sermon, please contact Barbara at the church office and a member of the board will contact you to discuss dates and the process further. We are also working with regional pastors to have a network of emergency contacts to draw upon for support when needed.

We will have many other needs for helping with leading services and other church tasks over the coming months until full-time Pastoral coverage can be secured. In addition to our normal service volunteer roles, we'd love to have people volunteer to lead one or several children's sermons, to volunteer with service assistance at Fairway View, to visit residents of Fairway View and other shut-in members of our congregation through the Caring Friends program along with our Parrish nurses. We'd also like to have some options for housing available if needed for those filling in from greater distances. Please contact Barbara to let her know if you can help in any of these ways.

We are so blessed to have a congregation with a heart to serve. We have an amazing Worship Arts and Music (WAM) committee that will continue to coordinate the music and other aspects of worship planning to support our service volunteers. Our great boards and committees will continue to serve in their respective areas, and our tremendous staff will be stepping up to provide additional support as needed. Special thanks to Liz Ketz for continuing our confirmation program, to Kaitlyn Burdorf for leading our Youth program with the excellent support of Ronda Thielke, and to our Parrish Nurses for continuing the FWV bible study and Caring Friends program. Special thanks as well to Barbara who will be instrumental in helping to coordinate the emergent and other needs of the church, providing the necessary service documents, and being the hub of our communications with the many volunteers, staff, boards, and committees above her normal duties. We couldn't do what we do normally, and especially now, without our wonderful custodial staff, tech crew, Choir Director, accompanists, and organists.

I'll leave you with a few final thoughts. We can dwell on the challenges of this situation and get mired down in a "woe is me" mentality; or we can do what we've done before at First English when we've faced other challenges and Step Up. Let's be kind and loving to one another; be forgiving of each other when we stumble or get stressed; and continue to give of our time, our ideas, our finances, and our talents in whatever ways we can to succeed through this interim period of filling our Pastoral position. Let's build each other up, pray for, and support one another. Let's be a beacon of God's light and love to our community and finally let's fervently pray for God to provide for our pastoral and other needs in both the short and long term. Let's trust that God has a plan and a purpose in all that he puts before us; and believe that whatever he brings us to, he will lovingly guide us through. May God continue to richly bless our congregation.

# FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes – December 4, 2023 (not yet approved)

Members present: Pastor Denise Fossen, Kristi Ehrenberg (president), Darin Ehrenberg- Stewardship, Kaitlyn Burdorf - Christian Ed, Gayla Athey-Youth & Family, Marge Dragseth - Evangelism, Marilyn Chindvall (vice president) and Lay Ministry, Michelle Bauer - Lay Ministry, Glenn Henningson-Church Properties, and Barbara Wegner-Secretary.

Meeting was called to order by President Kristi Ehrenberg at 8:04 pm.

Approval of November Minutes – Darin, Marge MSP.

Approval of November Treasurer's Report – Glenn, Gayla MSP.

Board of Lay Ministry – Marilyn Chindvall – Board approved the WAM report but tabled the request for someone to attend their meetings. (The board accepted WAM's proposal to increase Ministry of Music stipend to \$1200; organists to \$70 per Sunday and \$105 if 2 services; accompanist to \$16.00 per time). The board approved the endowment reports. They dispersed all their funds and gave some to the youth going to the National convention. Pastor Denise asked if someone would do the end of call for her final service, that will be Brent Zahrbock. The board authorized staff gifts totaling \$700. Plans for 12/31<sup>st</sup> service are coming together with coffee fellowship and cake. We've had one volunteer for the transition team. We will need 2 more. The board will listen to the council as to whether or not to contact Pastor Renee Tecklenburg to see if she is available but also made a list of possible lay leaders. The board worked on their budget. The Synod recommends 7% raises for rostered leaders and the board put in the budget what it would cost us to have a pastor of 10-years' experience, but the board knows we will need and use the staff more while not having pastor, so recommends 7% raises for the staff, except Kaitlyn as she was only recently hired. Liz will teach confirmation. Someone will talk with her concerning a possible Zion partnership.

Board of Evangelism – Marge Dragseth – Kim is working on the financial report. The board wishes to lower the budget by \$300 and is looking at cutting back some on purchasing devotionals (that are not being used). Due to all of the things that are going on (such as picking up bible studies at FWV), the board will not have a Mission Sunday, but will try to work on their own mission to help out without a pastor. There was an ad in the paper at Thanksgiving time for our Christmas services. The board hopes there will be an ad in the paper for Christmas leading up to it, but the board thinks advertising on Facebook is very valuable and Barbara handles that well. February midweek Lenten services will be catered to youth, (with adults welcome), to entice the

children to stay at the church between the meal and the church service. We're looking for rides for Martin Orman. Marge will call Barbara to get his sister's phone number to set something up. The board would like to see Pastor Tecklenburg every other week. She gave communion in the past, so it would be one way to get some communion services.

Christian Education – Kaitlyn Burdorf – Kayla is working on the annual report. The budget was sent to Liz. Carmen is working on dates for singing. The Sunday School program is looking good. We've got 48 kids performing.

Youth & Family - Gayla Athey - Kari is working on the annual report budget. The board would rather not have online sermons because they feel as if the congregation will not want to come if we don't have a leader present in church. There will be a bake sale fundraiser for the ELCA National Youth Gathering during the Christmas program. The board will be doing the Superbowl sub fundraiser after Christmas.

Stewardship - Darin Ehrenberg - The board looked at the financial reports and will drop the budget by \$50. The board recommended to stay on budget so we can increase in the future. We will be without a pastor's salary. The board wishes to increase the amount sent to the Synod in the future. Julie will write this year's annual report. Giving is up approximately \$12,000. The board feels as if online giving has helped to get more regular donations. The benevolence will stay the same as last year. The board didn't talk about Pastor Tecklenburg, but Darin mentioned maybe we could use her one Sunday a month. The board discussed whether we could inform the congregation during a temple talk about how the pastoral call process goes, so they know where we are in the process and know what to expect. Kristi pointed out if we're fortunate enough to get an interim pastor we'll have to pay that salary so we don't know whether we'll have that extra money or not.

Church Properties – Glenn Henningson – To replace the air conditioning in the Narthex it could cost \$7,500-\$7,600. The water fountain may be \$3,500-\$4,000. The board discussed having Hasslen Construction estimate replacing the cross and have them inspect the Bell area. Glenn will discuss the budget with Liz.

#### PASTOR'S REPORT - Pastor Denise

Worship - Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, and my last Sunday services have been planned. Worship Arts Ministry wanted another hymn added to the Christmas Eve afternoon service; after Communion we'll sing "Silent Night" and our last hymn will be "Joy to the World." Including the choir anthem and the communion distribution hymns there will be fourteen hymns with selected verses in each service. As the norm, there will be special music 30 minutes prior to each service on Christmas Eve afternoon. In our November WAM meeting, they were reminded of things that are upcoming and who to communicate with about them. Marilyn Hanson and I had selected hymns through mid-January. WAM is aware of the need to bring hymns, service setting, and liturgy to Barbara three weeks ahead of time. The Schmeichels assisted at my last Fairway View church service on December 3rd.

Pastoral Care - Ranet Schmeichel led Fairway View bible study with the questions I prepared on November 14th while I brought Kevin to his three-week post-op appointment in Sioux Falls. I visited a parishioner after a sibling called with their need for a home communion visit. Oddly, this person was removed from our directory due to a rumor of their death. Information given to the church office should be vetted. Graveside service was held November 22nd for Zachary Giese at the Clinton cemetery. I have been making final visits with Fairway View residents and others. I'll be meeting with the parish nurses on December 10th to plan next steps. My final bible study at FWV is December 26th.

Youth and Confirmation - Our final confirmation classes together will be December 13th. Classes start up again January 3rd with their interim teacher, Liz Ketz. All records of worship notes and attendance are current. All lessons and plans will be saved to a flash drive and the shared documents for easy access for the confirmation teacher.

Synod and Community - The Lac Qui Parle conference meeting was held November 16th in Dawson. The synod held a zoom meeting on November 30th on narrative budgets that I attended. I have an exit interview with a representative of the synod on December 8th. December Lac Qui Parle conference meeting is December 21st in Madison.

Thank you for your devotion to serving FELC and our mission to proclaim God's love to all.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us.


of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray; cast out our sin, and enter in, be born in us today."
