FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes – April 8th, 2024 (not yet approved)

Members present: Kristi Ehrenberg (president), Marilyn Chindvall (vice president) and Lay Ministry, Becky Parker (treasurer) and Stewardship, Darin Ehrenberg-Stewardship, Kari Dorry-Youth & Family, Archer Dorry – Youth & Family, Kaitlyn Burdorf-Christian Education, Marge Dragseth -Evangelism, Sara Mattison – Lay Ministry, Glenn Henningson -Church Properties, and Barbara Wegner-Secretary.

Meeting was called to order by President Kristi Ehrenberg at 7:55 pm. The discussion on the window shades was tabled until we could get samples and prices to consider.

Approval of April Minutes as presented - Kari, Becky MSP.

Approval of April Treasurer's Report – We are about \$12,000 behind last year in our giving. The money given to the Synod is down 4% from last year and we haven't been paying a pastor. If we got a full-time pastor, we would have to use reserve funds to pay for him or her. Our budget for the Ministry Site Profile is about \$255,000. Last time was \$285,000. Marilyn, Marge MSP.

Board of Lay Ministry – Sara Mattison – The board reviewed and approved the WAM & Endowment Committee reports (approving \$1,700 for camp scholarships from the Endowment report). Marilyn showed the board the cross gifts for seniors and they look very nice. We have pulpit supply through August 18th and Marilyn has someone in mind to ask for the 25th. Josh Wollschlager agreed to join the Call Committee. There is only one spot open on the board for vacancy. Kristi Ehrenberg will serve a one-year term to help transition the board. Ellie Helgeson will be Vice President.

Board of Evangelism – Marge Dragseth – The board has two families to talk with to see if they will officially join the church. The boards main mission right now is working on finishing up the photo directory in order to print it. The board will be reaching out to a few more people to see if they will be willing to add a picture to the directory before it's printed. The directories will be free (1 per household) if the family added their picture. They will be available for \$5 for those who didn't. Marge ordered cupcakes for the mothers of the congregation on Mother's Day, May 12th. The mothers will receive a cupcake as they leave church. The board would like to see a community service down at the park for our September 1st, Labor Day weekend, service.

Christian Education – Kaitlyn Burdorf – VBS will be held at Zion Lutheran Church from Sunday, June 9th – Thursday, June 13th each evening from 6:30pm – 8:45pm. It is called The Great Jungle Journey, where they will learn about the 7 C's of History [They are Creation, Corruption, Catastrophe, Confusion, Christ, Cross, and Consummation. There was a spelling error in the bulletins mixing up the words Consummation and Consumption leading to a discussion of dark material.] The board thanks Marilyn Chindvall for getting the crosses and will find someone to pass them out to the seniors. Sunday School is done for the year and went well this year. Kaitlyn was the only one at the meeting, so the board will discuss next year's Sunday School plan at the next meeting. The board already recognized their teacher/volunteers last month. Amanda Stattelman and Kandra Kellen will be joining the board this summer.

Youth & Family – Kari Dorry – Ashleigh Neuman has agreed to join this board. She's not currently a member (but Evangelism would like to reach out and ask if she will consider joining). Non-members can be on the board but cannot vote at the council meetings. Four seniors (Wyatt Sherod, Owen & Eliot Dorry, and Jaclyn Wiik) are participating in our Senior Sunday service on May 19th. The picture board is up in the Narthex. All fees are covered for the kids & adults. Food money is the only need left for some of the younger kids. Kari is telling the parents that if they can cover it, great, if not, we will figure something out. The board may make an announcement to the congregation about that expense. The wall of money funds collected will help in that regard. The plans are coming together well. The trip will be July 15-21st. Alan, Misty & Kari will be taking 10 kids to New Orleans (8 from FELC & 2 from the cities). 17 kids and 3 adults will be going to Green Lake Bible Camp this summer. Endowment is giving \$100 to each of those students. Kaitlyn is hoping to do summer activities this summer in partnership with Zion. The board is happy with having four members (with Ashleigh joining), but if someone wants to join the board, they won't be turned down.

Stewardship – Darin Ehrenberg – The good news stories for May will be Larry Dahle's ushering story, 4 grads receiving quilts, a thank you for the moms, and that our pulpit supply is good through August. The board will also be mentioning to keep an eye out for the Ministry Site Profile surveys. Becky will discuss with Barbara getting those in the bulletins. The board had designated the Lent offerings to Green Lake VBS, but will use it for our Zion partnered VBS this summer. If we get back to doing a Green Lake VBS in the future, we can designate our future Lent offerings for it that year.

Church Properties – Glenn Henningson – The church cleanup date is set for May 13th and Dean has a list of things to do. Glenn thinks the leak around the stained glass in the narthex may be coming from the roof, so Glenn and Dean will go look at it. Approval of \$1,400 to repair the cross. Glenn, Kari, MSP. Glenn has not heard back about the bells, but will contact him again. One of the trees is dead. Someone will buy a new one and we can dig it out & put the new one in on the cleanup day. Kristi asked what the plan was for the uneven concreate. The board can get it ground down so that it's evened out.

The council discussed whether or not we should continue paying the KDIO radio station to broadcast our services each Sunday. The Board of Stewardship believed we should keep it up to reach the elderly who can't come or don't otherwise get to hear a service. The other question about rotating services with Zion led to the next question if Zion has the capability to broadcast on KDIO. Zion would like to do more with technology, such as putting information up on the screens, and Kristi gave them some contact information for our techy people. But we don't know if they have the ability to broadcast on KDIO. The Youth board discussed how we broadcast on Facebook and YouTube (it's also on TV every Wednesday) and wondered if we need to still do the radio broadcast in addition to all of that. So the board of Youth & Family asked about pausing the service to see how many people complain. The problem with pausing it would be that it would be difficult to impossible to get the timeslot back after giving it up. The council was agreed that if we had to keep up with one of these (KDIO or getting our FB service to Fairway View) we want to keep up with out Fairway View services.

The second question, "if our service time changes, how would that affect our Fairway View service", was discussed. The Board of Christian Ed. Was willing to be flexible but wondered how that time change would affect Sunday School. Sunday School could perhaps be at the same time each week (ex. 10 am) but before or after service depending on when the service is (ex. 9 or 11 am). The Fairway View service could possibly be another day of the week or 1:00 pm but if it's so late after the service you might have difficulty finding volunteers. The time change switch would be quarterly at the minimum. If we switched times with Zion while having the same pastor doing the services, whichever church had the early service could be the one to get that service over to Fairway View, but we will couldn't have the pastor there (because he or she would be doing the other service).

There was discussion about meeting up at the park for a Sunday service. Hans would probably be okay with it, but others may not. Having service in the park comes with some cons such as: chance of bad weather, bees, extra work and cost of getting speakers out there, parking issues, chairs for elderly, and kids being distracted. Another option was discussed where one Sunday we invite all of Zion to FELC's service and one summer we all go to Zion's service. The partnership group will ask about possibly having FELC go to Zion's church service on June 9th to kick off the Vacation Bible School.

The discussion of switching times was tabled until we know more about it. The KDIO radio broadcast question will be added to the annual election meeting agenda. Zion will be asked if they want to have us for service on June 9th.

Marilyn Chindvall, Kristi & Darin Ehrenberg will help service coffee for Senior Recognition on May 19th.

Next council meeting will be on Monday, June 3 at 7:00 p.m. Closed with Lord's Prayer at 8:43 p.m.



Reflection #5: Christ.

One body in Christ. Christ: How do we say or hear this name for Jesus? How do we use God's name? Like the Small Catechism says, do we use it "to curse, swear, practice magic, lie, or deceive"? Or "to call on, pray to, praise, and give thanks to God?"

In the language of scripture, the word "Christ" is "Christos." It appears as a title and as a name, referring to the Anointed One, the Messiah, Jesus Christ, Christ Jesus, or Jesus the Christ. In the Gospels, people who meet Jesus wonder if he is the "Messiah." But it is after Easter, in the saving events of the crucifixion and resurrection, that we hear "Jesus Christ" or "Christ Jesus" named as the one who in fact accomplishes our salvation. St. Paul centers everything he teaches on



the message of the cross and refers to the name of "Christ" hundreds of times in his letters.

Paul was a church-planter, and his letters reveal how diverse those early churches were, both in terms of whom they comprised and in what they believed. Paul writes to the Christians in Corinth in response to a letter he has received from them about tensions in their community. People are divided. They are gossiping and putting each other down. Some claim allegiance to one leader; other factions rally around a different teacher. Some think the person who baptized them was the best. Some believe they possess the only right way to worship. Some point to their spiritual gifts as the most important. Some argue about how they ought to interact with the government and the culture around them. Although Paul has the authority to call them to allegiance to him, he gets himself out of the way so that the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ remains central. It is in Christ – not in their practices – that they are made one.

Note what Paul says: 10 Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you but that you be knit together in the same mind and the same purpose. 11 For it has been made clear to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. 12 What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." 13 Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? 14 I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, 15 so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. 16 I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else. 17 For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel—and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

We all know that the church struggles with these same tensions today. Meetings, emails, and phone calls express our concerns about how we are to live together in our congregations. Our contexts are different. The shape of ministries in cities, farmland, and towns varies. Some of us expect the church today to be the way it was 10 or 20 years ago. Some complain that their pastor does not do things the way Pastor So-and-So did. Generational shifts have been predicted, but now we are living in the tensions of change. Churches, businesses, and organizations are in transition. People have different opinions about everything, and the gaps between us only seem to be widening.

That means the words of St. Paul over two thousand years ago are so relevant for our life together and even the survival of the church today. Paul reminds us that we not only preach Christ crucified and risen; in baptism, you and I are joined to Christ the Anointed One. "And it is God who establishes us with you in Christ, and has anointed us, and who has also put his seal on us and given us his Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee." (2 Cor. 1:21-22).

In our baptism into Christ, we are made one. Baptism doesn't make us identical, nor does it take away our differences. We will go to meetings where different opinions are expressed, but at the end of the day, those who are in Christ avoid the kind of gossip that was going on in Corinth. Healthy communities do not talk about, they talk to. They live as one.

Right now, your congregation is concluding another school year. This synod is moving toward a Synod Assembly. All of us live in a culture that tries to pit us against each other. In this time, may we live our belief that it is in the foolishness of the cross that God's greatest wisdom and gift is known. May you live as though you are one body in Christ, because you are. One. Body. In. Christ.
