Notes from Pastor Cheryl



Hello and greetings everyone. I am thrilled to be serving as your parttime Interim Pastor at First English and Zion Lutheran congregations. Currently, my office hours are at Zion on Tuesday from 10 am until 4 pm; First English on Wednesday from 11 am until 5:30 pm; and First English on Thursday from 10 am until 3 pm, or as needed. I also work from home some so I'm available at other times as well.

On Wednesday there is generally confirmation class beginning at 3:30 so the afternoon is filled with getting ready and set up for that. On Thursdays I try to use some of the day for visitation so it's good to call ahead just in case. I am also available to meet by appointment for those who are working during the day. You are welcome to call or text me (605-237-1501), send an email (<u>CMQRondeau@outlook.com</u>) or FB message (<u>cheryl.rondeaubassett</u>).

At this time, I will be rotating between the two congregations for worship services being at Zion the first Sunday of October and First English the second. Reformation Day I will be at both for Confirmation: First English at 9 am and Zion services at 11 am.

I was ordained in June of 2015 and served two parishes prior to coming to Ortonville. I love it that I can go home every night since I just live at Wilmot, SD. (Within reason for winter of course.)

Ministry was not my first career as I have owned several businesses including a weekly newspaper (the Wilmot Enterprise), restaurants, and real estate brokerage; been a computer trainer, learning center director, and taught community college classes; and was a Marketing Communications Manager for a manufacturing company. All roles that developed my skills for ministry.

### FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING Council Minutes – September 9, 2024 (not yet approved)

Members present: Jon Anderson (president), Ellie Helgeson (vice president) and *Lay Ministry*, Becky Parker (treasurer) and Stewardship, Darin Ehrenberg - Stewardship, Archer Dorry- Youth & Family, Kaitlyn Burdorf-Christian Education, Marla Strei - Evangelism, Kristi Ehrenberg – Lay Ministry, Dale Price - Church Properties, and Barbara Wegner-Secretary. Meeting was called to order by President Jon Anderson at 7:45 pm.

Approval of August Minutes as presented – Kristi, Darin MSP.

**Approval of Treasurer's Report** – We're down about \$11k year-to-date from last year in giving. Becky was given a breakdown of office supply costs because the amount spent is over-budget this year because costs for items & services have increased. We will need to budget more for office supplies next year. – Darin, Dale **MSP**.

**Board of Lay Ministry** – Kristi Ehrenberg – **All Board Items:** Concerning how to incorporate this year's theme verse in the board, Lay Ministry will think about doing things out of love for our congregation & keeping it in mind while searching for a minister & recognizing the staff for their extra efforts. God's Work, Our Hands (GWOH) day went well. The birthday bags were a hit & the other activities went well. The board thought that having fewer activities & having individuals in charge of each activity worked out nicely. The board is okay with the council meeting at any time, but the preference is for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday after church. The board will find someone to record it & get the recording to Barbara to write up the minutes. Liz is working on the Protect My Ministry training for anyone new who needs to complete it. Lay Ministry recommends having a signup sheet (instead of just 1 person) for preparing the suppers during Lent. If there are not enough volunteers, then maybe each board could take a night. Kristi will do the confirmation interviews on

Wednesday. Lay Ministry Board Items: Lay Ministry approves the WAM report with the following caveats: The full chime set can be purchased for \$1,895 so long as it doesn't come out of the budget. WAM can use Thrivent, Endowment or other funds to buy the chimes. WAM noted in their minutes that they were not asking that this be put in the budget. Lay Ministry does not want to purchase the cymbals (about \$1000) and used drum set (about \$300). Ellie has a drum set FELC can borrow and she said cymbals can be found for a lot cheaper. Ellie has great cymbals she bought used. Until we get a pastor in & more stability with our funds the board thinks this should be tabled unless they can find other funding for that. There was also discussion on whether or not we have the space to store or place it during a service. Everything else in the WAM report was fine. Concerning pulpit supply, the board will look for an alternate person for Dec. 29<sup>th</sup> (which was erroneously believed to be one of our days with Pastor Cheryl) and we shouldn't need Pastor Hans for December 15th which is the Christmas program. We can get a member to help lead that service. Staff interviews have been divided out so they will be contacted by someone from the board to set those up. Concerning our Thanksgiving & Christmas services, we will wait until we hear more from Zion and how those will work with the partnership. The board recommends 1 Christmas service at FELC and 1 at Zion & our pastor can do both services. Kristi mentioned that the MN state law concerning Sick & Safe time has been changed and she will discuss those changes with Liz. Those changes will be added to the employee handbook. Now you can use the time for bereavement, the company doesn't have to give the S&S time to employees that they're pretty certain won't reach 80 hours, and you don't have to have it on every pay stub (it just has to be somewhere accessible to the employees).

Board of Evangelism – Marla Strei – The board met prior to God's Work, Our Hands Sunday. There are a few who may become new members, but they are not 100% ready to transfer in yet. Barbara mentioned that pastors (Denise & Cheryl) both have mentioned having the announcement in the bulletin every week for a month prior to the service so people can see it and reach out if they want to join that day as well. Evangelism can keep this in mind when choosing a date in the future and let Barbara know as soon as they know what day it will be. It was mentioned that it could go into the newsletter as well. Barbara will need to be told the date a month and a half or so early to be able to put it on the monthly calendar and get it in the newsletter. Evangelism members thought they needed to have someone present at the confirmation interviews, but were told they were covered so no one will be there. The directory distribution is going okay. There was no way to anticipate the phone number typo but it has been fixed with a sticker. Everyone thinks the directories are nice & members thanked Barbara for her work. There is another request from the board for funds from the Endowment Fund to help pay for those. Heritage Printing screwed up 3 copies (leaving out the addresses pages) but have corrected the error, and they're happy they we shop local. The board thinks winter will be a better time for the Just for the Love of it Dinner due to other local meals happening in fall. It was suggested that the youth do one in January. Pastor Cheryl was interested in getting the children involved in something like this. Marla mentioned if they want to do something, there are great resources available. The board is looking into incorporating the theme into cross-generational projects. The board is okay with having their individual meetings at different times than the council meetings so there is less time pressure to discuss items. The board is okay with each board taking on a meal for Lent, or perhaps getting family volunteers.

**Christian Education** – Kaitlyn Burdorf – The board is still figuring out how to incorporate the theme and is okay with changing the council meetings to Sunday after church. Amanda Stattelman will be presenting the bibles on September 22<sup>nd</sup>. Youth group starts September 25<sup>th</sup>. Sara will be at the Confirmation Interviews. The Sunday School curriculum is the same from last year because the board didn't get through all of it. Sunday School snacks will be taken care of by Ashley when there is no one serving coffee. Sara will contact Carmen and Pete about when the children will sing in worship. The board is looking to more of a classical Christmas Program this year with more traditional songs. Sara will ask Liz to print the milestones on bright paper and laminate them for each classroom. Last day of Sunday School is presentation day.

Youth & Family - Archer Dorry - All Board Items: The board felt GWOH was successful and suggested moving Rally Sunday to our GWOH day in the future to get more youth to come and be involved in the activities. Youth & Family would like to move the Council meetings to Sunday after church and thought this might allow more parents to join the board (while they're kids are in Sunday School). The board doesn't care which Sunday of the month that meeting would be. Concerning the Lenten meal, the group thought maybe each board could take care of one meal. Youth & Family Items: There will be no Kid's Club as of now, but Youth Group starts on the 25<sup>th</sup> at 5:30pm. The 2027 National Youth Gathering will be in Minneapolis. Covenant Night will be on September 25<sup>th</sup> at First English. The Junior High Youth Gathering will be in Wilmar, Nov. 22nd-23rd which conflicts with the Ortonville play. Every year there is a conflict. If needed, Archer is available to go to the Confirmation Interviews from 4:30-5:30 and Kari can be there from 5:30-6:30. Stewardship - Darin Ehrenberg - Julie did some research on the three elements, Trust, Hope, and Love. The board wants to do a Temple Talk concerning each element over 3 Sundays, November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 17<sup>th</sup>. The board thought having less projects for GWOH day was good and it was nice to have someone leading each project. Stewardship prefers Monday nights for the council. The sign-up sheets for the Lenten service sounds like a good idea. The board wants to stuff envelopes in Oct. & mail them in Nov. Julie found a symbol the board wants to use as their symbol for the year. The board also likes the bulletin picture that Barbara created for the year's theme. The board wants to know when Barbara needs the information for the stewardship letter so they can have them printed and ready to be stuffed by the Oct. board meeting. Concerning the WAM minutes, Stewardship didn't think the chimes or drums were necessary & thought it should be tabled for now as we're trying to keep the church going. If they can raise the money, that's up to them. In the Good News, the board will talk about GWOH, Rally Sunday, & the Bible Presentation. Also, Pastor Cheryl's office hours & scheduled days (9/15 & 9/29) will be listed. Julie will work on that and get that to Barbara. Stewardship discussed the idea of having one Thanksgiving service here and then alternating years with Zion, and also perhaps having one Christmas service time at each church each year. So, perhaps, Pastor Cheryl would do one Christmas Eve service here and one at Zion and members could choose which church to go to based on whichever service time worked for their schedule best.

Church Properties - Dale Price - There was an evaporation problem in the back with all the humidity, and changing the furnace mitigated it but hasn't fixed it completely. We will wait and see if it reoccurs next year and may have to do some changes to the air conditioning unit by reinsulating it. So that's on hold. We've got a couple of bids out for the back hallway around the bell tower. We're waiting for an estimate on replacement carpet. We're waiting on a bid for internal wall work, painting, and so on. As far as the water coming through, that's been mitigated and cleared up somewhat. We've contracted with someone to fix the bell tower. We waited to make sure there was liability insurance for whoever comes on the property. He has submitted a certificate of liability insurance. Pat Dwyer (Gunner) is supposed to that as well since he's scheduled to do something above the atrium, but he's backed up. We're on his list, and he will get to us when he can. Board members did some crack-filling in the asphalt and it's settled so they may do more if they want to get it really smooth. The board is happy with the meetings as they are right now. Dean is our point person and meets with our contractors a lot of the time. The board appreciates him. A copy of the agreement with Pastor Cheryl is available if someone wants to look at it. The signed copy will go to Liz and be filed in the office. She will be at Zion on Tuesdays for 6 hours, at FELC on Wednesday for 7 hours and also here on Thursday for 5 hours. Wed. is confirmation classes which include students from Zion. Her hours are on her door & in the bulletin, but she may need to be elsewhere if there are visitations or funerals. There is a meeting with Zion on Wed to go over issues that have come up. She is thinking of taking a day off (from Zion) to visit family MEA weekend when there's no confirmation. Maybe we can have a shared service here & one there. 4 boards said Sunday was their preference & 2 said Monday was better. We'll try Sundays.



Jon Anderson emailed the board that, since there was confusion on this point, the individual boards can meet right after church service on the 13<sup>th</sup> and if any boards have previously met, they can enjoy coffee fellowship until the voting meeting is ready to start. Jon asked for everyone to attend the full board meeting in October (if possible).

## Parish Nurse Article for October

Rachel was the wife of Jacob and mother of Joseph and Benjamin. Rachel's father was Laban and her older sister was Leah. Rachel means "Shepherd" in the Bible; which fit her well since she tended her father's flock. Jacob happens upon her (Genesis 29) as she is about to water her father's flock. During Jacob's stay with Laban, (to escape his brother Esau) he fell in love with Rachel. He agreed to work 7 years for Laban in return for Rachel's hand in marriage. On the night of the wedding Jacob was deceived and Leah was substituted for Rachel.

Later Jacob confronted Laban, who insisted that the older daughter should marry first. Then he could marry Rachel after working another 7 years as payment for her. Jacob truly loved Rachel, so he agreed. (Genesis 29:20). His love for her was so strong that it seemed to him to be days. Her beauty was unparalleled and she must've had a beautiful soul to have Jacob work 7 more years for her hand in marriage. Rachel was unable to have children for a long time but God heard her cries (Genesis 30:22) and blessed her with children in His own time. She loved and trusted God. She became the mother of Joseph and Benjamin. She died shortly after giving birth to Benjamin at age 44. We must always remember that God is in control and lead us in the right direction if we trust him.




First English's cross has been repaired and reinstalled!
