## Notes from Pastor Cheryl



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"8Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. 19I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isa 43)

God was speaking to the people about change, telling them to trust in Him as it will be a positive thing. Change is hard for people as it pushes you out of the comfortable way of living you've known for some time. It often seems the wrong way to move forward from a routine way of living.

But change is a constant in life, for only Jesus does not change, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever," (Heb 13:8) which we can be thankful for.

At this time, decisions are to be made on whether to join in a call. You may feel you are in the wilderness, questioning why adjustments must be made. It's hard to perceive anything different as you dwell on what has been, that place of security. But God promises you a new thing.

"The days are coming," declares the LORD, "when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah. (Jer 31:31)

According to Amber Rose Monaco writing an online blog for Huffpost, new things help you grow as you learn from new opportunities and experiences. She states, change makes you more flexible and adaptable. Something you found a couple years ago with COVID. Churches had to quickly be flexible and adapt to new ways of proclaiming the gospel. It was challenging but the gospel was proclaimed and thrived through online services, parking lot and outdoor worship, and innovative ways to reach out to each other.

Congregations throughout the country continue to encounter change with reduced attendance and less financial support. The change Martin Luther and the Reformers made were not welcome in their time, but we know they were for good and not evil.

Rebecca Crespo, Creator of Minimalism Made Simple writes in an October 2023 blog *entitled 15 Inspirational Reasons Why Change is Good* explains change is:

- A period of transition where we discover new interest, skills, and perspectives that shape our understanding of ourselves and the world around us.
- It helps us to reevaluate our goals and priorities, to look outside the box for new opportunities and experiences that help us move forward often in a more exciting way to improve how we live together 'as communion of saints on earth'.
- Replacing old and worn-out ways of doing things provides interest for a new and younger generation who often have other attitudes, values, and needs.
- We become more humble and grateful by letting go of old habits and behaviors that limit our mission and prevent others from feeling welcome and included.
- It gives us hope for the future when we are flexible through a willingness to adapt to new ideas reassuring us that difficult and bad times do not last forever.

Change helps us refocus our identity on who we are as God's people in our world and community. The world has changed, God has not. He still empowers us by the Holy Spirit, calls and sends us to bear witness to God's creative, redeeming, and sanctifying activity in the world. Not only inside the church but across the community. God encourages us saying: "See, I will create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered, nor will they come to mind." (Isa 65:17)

Congregations all have unique personalities as do First English and Zion. Individually that will not change, but you can find ways to work together, sharing your resources of time, personnel and expertise, and continue to be the people God has called you to be.

For all are called... sent... to be witness to His creative ways, to see what God is up to, hearing God speak, join in to be about His work in new and changing ways, with God's will as the focus.

For the members of First English and Zion, this is an exciting time for, "Fiven though we speak in this way, beloved, we are confident of better things in your case, things that belong to salvation. For God is not unjust; he will not overlook your work and the love that you showed for his sake in serving the saints, as you still do." (Heb 6)

Together, you can handle the changes God has planned for you as Jeremiah 29 tells you, "I For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. 12 Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you."

### FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes - October 13, 2024 (not yet approved)

Members present: Jon Anderson (president), Ellie Helgeson (vice president) and Lay Ministry, Cody Backstrand - Lay Ministry, Kristi Ehrenberg - Lay Ministry, Emily Sigler - Lay Ministry, Michelle Bauer - Lay Ministry, Darin Ehrenberg - Stewardship, Alan Hodenfield - Youth & Family, Archer Dorry - Youth & Family, Kari Dorry - Youth & Family, Kandra Kellen - Christian Education, Kaitlyn Burdorf-Christian Education, Amanda Stattelman - Christian Education, Marla Strei - Evangelism, Dale Price - Church Properties.

Members discussed how to proceed with council meetings in the future. The council wants to continue to meet on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the month with the agendas being distributed before the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of the month or ASAP. The council will change the way they meet to have the smaller board groups meeting right after church on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday (or at a different day of their own choosing), and then each board will send a voting member to the voting meeting around 10:30, keeping in mind that they may need to allow extra time to boards when things get busy and they should inform everyone if the time for the voting meeting will change (so that boards who met prior to that Sunday can know when to show up). The smaller board groups can choose to meet after service in other, more-private locations. The Evangelism board found having the agenda early and meeting earlier to be helpful so that they could get things done before the voting meeting.

Some members left.

Meeting was called to order by President Jon Anderson at 10:31 am.

**Approval of September Minutes** as presented - Marla, Dale **MSP.** 

**Approval of Treasurer's Report** – We were a little short this past month. We have had a new assessment which we will have to pay. We now have two assessments. We can pay it off at any time within 20 years. – Amanda, Ellie **MSP.** 

**Board of Lay Ministry** – Emily Sigler – Lay Ministry approved the WAM report and recommended one Christmas Eve service at 2:30 pm based on historical attendance (Zion will hold one Christmas Eve service as well). The board is okay with the Blue Christmas service & election prayer service that Pastor Cheryl asked about. The choir stipend was tabled until a budget meeting. The board approved the finance work group and endowment. Ellie will lead our December 29<sup>th</sup> service. The board is okay with the 7:00 pm service on Thanksgiving Eve. The board tabled the appointing an Endowment Committee member because they wanted more information about that.

The board tabled the discussion of renumeration for the organists/pianists and choir director until they could discuss with Becky and the finance committee. The board is okay with the FELC Choir and community member Advent Cantata on December 7-8<sup>th</sup> at the Abbey of the Hills. Kristi will ask Barbara to send out the interview questions and job descriptions so that the board members can start their staff interviews. Those interviews should be done before the November council meeting.

Jon brought up that Pastor Cheryl was more than willing to do another Christmas Eve service. There was discussion of whether or not there would be too many people if we only had one service and if that would discourage people from coming. But Lay Ministry had already made their decision based on historical attendance to stick with one service rather than having a later service.

**Board of Evangelism** – Marla Strei – The board discussed how to incorporate the yearly theme; they decided, "Trusting that our loving Lord will guide us in the direction we need to go, we are hopeful people." The board recommended Marilyn Hanson & Ethel Swenson for the internal audit of the books, both with business backgrounds. The board thought that in the interest of safety the Narthex doors would remain locked and people could be directed to the lower door during office hours. Maybe a sign could be placed directing people to the "Office." The board is excited to transfer in some new people. It is important to reach out to new people. New Member Sunday will be held on November 10<sup>th</sup>. The board of evangelism recommends Bryson, Brandon, Miley & Madilyn be confirmed on Sunday, October 27, 2024. Our mission emphasis Sunday will be November 24<sup>th</sup> and the emphasis will be on Katie's Kicks. Kirsten Karels will speak about that.

**Christian Education** – Amanda Stattelman – Kandra Kellen will email Barbara for the list of the confirmation students to confirm who all to get gifts for. The refuge scavenger hunt went great. The board has to remember to bring pencils, as those were forgotten this year. For the kid's Christmas Program, Marilyn Chindvall will be asked to help. If she says, "No," then Amanda will pitch in and pull something together. The board was told that people wished for a more traditional service so that is what the board will do this year. Kandra will contact Sioux Historic for a skating event prices and dates. The board is thinking about a Sunday after church with pizza offered for lunch, or do it right after lunch. They board would like to do a sign up sheet in advance to figure out how many people to plan for. Kandra can bring items for smaller children to do at the tables and will check with Liz to see what is in the budget, ie. if families will pay for their own pizza or not. Nov. 17<sup>th</sup> is when the children will sing in the service, and Carmen will lead this and they will sing songs from Vacation Bible School. The skating event could possibly be in January or February. There was discussion on asking Zion if they want to participate.

**Youth & Family** – Jon read their minutes as the members left earlier – Two individuals from Zion have been coming to the youth events. They will not be going to the Synod's Jr. High Youth Gathering on Nov. 22<sup>nd</sup>–24<sup>th</sup> because it falls on the same weekend as the High School play.

**Stewardship** – Darin Ehrenberg – The board was fine with Dean opening the Narthex doors and they stuffed the envelopes with the Stewardship Drive letter and pledge cards. The board will hold a temple talk for the 1st three Sundays in November around this year's theme words and will discuss the packets and get people to pick those up to save postage. If you ever have any ideas for the Good News newsletter the board of Stewardship you can email someone on the board about that. Usually the board does four topics. There was discussion on mentioning New Members in November or October, or possible both. We are minus \$11,000 for 2024 giving. We will keep this in mind when making the budget for 2025. Ellie asked about maybe having someone from the bank to come to the church to help people change their automatic giving. It is difficult for some to change their automatic giving at the bank.

Church Properties – Dale Price – We completed getting the cross installed and that went smoothly. We've received two checks for damage on the back hallway. We're holding those as we're still getting estimates for repair. We have estimates from Kay Carpeting and also we're waiting for a bid for the stairwell. Glenn Henningson is working with Art to see if they're willing to replace the sheetrock. The roof repair above the Narthex was completed by Gunner, unfortunately we are waiting for a repair on the side window that was damaged by Gunner. It is the outer panel, so we're not worried about water problems. We have received an assessment for \$8,582.00 for infrastructure work done on the Monroe street. That will be added to our current assessment we got last year for the street on the other side. Perhaps a signpost could be added to direct people to the side door so we could make the practice of keeping the Narthex doors locked a permanent thing.

We had a Zion-FELC partnership transition team created a while back. Dale **motioned** to suspend the transition team, due to the fact that the executive committee meets with both parties. Marla **seconded**.

Pastor Cheryl has given her time sheet and she is consistently spending 30 hours a week, so the executive committee would like approval to increase her hours from 24 to 30 retroactive to October 1st. Marla, Amanda **MSP**.

There will be another meeting between the two executive committees on November 6<sup>th</sup> and they will be discussing more of the long-term issues about having an interim pastor full-time. Maybe after the 6<sup>th</sup>, Jon would explain during church what we are doing. Come January, we may have Pastor Cheryl be full-time (shared with Zion) like we would when we did an official call. One issue is church times. Zion is pretty understanding about our KDIO & Fairway View commitments but we still need to firm the times up. They offered to do the Interim at 50/50, but that percentage will change when she shifts to full-time. It may come down to a mathematical formula concerning attendance. Zion is happy about how things are going.

Jon will email the transition team thanking them for their service.

Motion to Adjourn, Ellie, Amanda, MSP.

Next council meeting will be on Sunday, November 10<sup>th</sup> after church services.






