

Notes from Pastor Cheryl



December 23, 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Sunday, December 22nd, First English council approved a partnership agreement with Zion Lutheran. The Zion council approved it on December 17th. Next the agreement will go out to the congregations and the two will vote on it at their annual meetings on January 19th.

Most of you are familiar with partnerships as there are many kinds and forms of these types of arrangement. One of the best known this arrangement resembles is that of a marriage where two unique individuals with different personalities come together, united as one, yet remain two individuals.

Scripture tells us in Ecclesiastics 4: ⁹Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. ¹⁰For if they fall, one will lift up the other; but woe to one who is alone and falls and does not have another to help. ¹²And though one might prevail against another, two will withstand one. A threefold cord is not quickly broken."

This partnership is like that threefold cord of two congregations with God in the middle. And as partnerships work, especially marriage partnerships, it will take cooperation, openness, willingness, and a lot of give and take.

Of course I look at this from the outside, as a pastor working between the two congregations. My goal is to find ways for it to flow more easily between the two keeping the uniqueness of each and enhancing their gifts while making it feasible for a pastor to serve both.

Last month I talked about the need for good communication in the newsletter article, which is needed to collaborate and receive the benefits of a threefold cord. Threefold as Paul reminds us: "750 neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. 8The one who plants and the one who waters have a common purpose, and each will receive wages according to the labor of each. 9For we are God's servants, working together; you are God's field, God's building." (1Corinthians 3)

You have already experienced how well it works, as you held Vacation Bible School together last summer, then combined confirmation classes this fall. The Youth Group has been meeting together for some time and will hold a skating event on the first Sunday in January. Going forward there will be other things to work together on.

In January, the pastor will lead morning worship services for both congregations. This has been the biggest hurdle and takes a great deal of cooperation to allow the pastor to be at both in a limited amount of time.

l ask for your prayers to hear God's wisdom and guidance, just as Jesus spoke to us through John 15: "⁴Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing."

I ask for your understanding to see how God is working a new thing in you that is about His purpose for you. "IBDo not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. IB am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43)

And I ask for your patience as we all consider the other in our decisions. "¹²As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. ¹³Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. ¹⁴Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony." (Colossians 3)

I am excited to be on this journey with you as we all work together for the mission and ministry given to us by Jesus. And as Paul writes: "I thank my God every time I remember you, *constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, *because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ." (Philippians 1)

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes December 8, 2024 (not yet approved)

Members present: Pastor Cheryl Rondeau-Bassett, Jon Anderson (president), Ellie Helgeson (vice president) and *Lay Ministry*, Becky Parker (treasurer) *and Stewardship*, Sara Wollschlager – *Christian Education*, Glenn Henningson – Church Properties, Julie Schneider – *Stewardship*, Michelle Bauer – *Lay Ministry*, Cody Backstrand – *Lay Ministry*, Alan Hodenfield – *Youth & Family*, Jane Debner – *Evangelism*.

Meeting was called to order by President Jon Anderson at 10:37 am.

Approval of November Minutes as presented – Becky, Michelle MSP.

Approval of Treasurer's Report – We have received the first two months of payments from Zion. It will be recorded differently in January to make it more readily visible. Julie, Glenn **MSP**.

Board of Lay Ministry – Michelle Bauer Reported – Ellie met with Liz and Becky on the budget. The board is looking for a replacement for Kristi. The board has a few recommendations on updating a little bit of the language in the partnership agreement. Lay Ministry recommends each board taking a month of Coffee Fellowship, being responsible for getting volunteer servers for those Sundays. Lay Ministry recommends keeping the minutes more general with less names mentioned when just discussing things. Barbara knows and she agreed. WAM minutes and Endowment minutes were approved. The board has names in mind for the Endowment committee. The board is okay with moving the communion Sundays around and splitting Lenten services with Zion (1 Wednesday here, next there, etc.) if needed. The board wanted to make a note that the WAM group is an advisory role, working with the pastor, but our pastor will have final say in how the services go. WAM's work, especially during COVID, is very much appreciated, but Pastor has to be the final say so that Barbara can know what the bulletins should look like and she can go to Pastor Cheryl with any questions. Pastor Cheryl would like PowerPoint on the computer in the sanctuary and is willing to teach Marina on how to use it.

Council discussion on the partnership & pastoral agreements – The partnership agreement the council had printed up would not be the ultimate one because of the addition of Synod advisements. Some things from the Pastoral Agreement will go into the Partnership Agreement (without her name) as an example of the mechanics (such as the split, hours, and times of service). There was a suggestion that the mileage language could be updated and there is a need to figure out if mileage starts from the home or from the church and whether it should be spelled out in the agreement. The interim agreement can be cancelled with 30 days of notice. The Partnership agreement has to be for at least two years (according to Synod advisement). It will be reviewed annually. There was also discussion on the vacation time and the need for specifics of whether it should be calculated in terms of weeks or days for the Pastoral agreement. It was also brought up that the congregation should be informed that our Ministry Site Profile (MSP) wasn't active and that's why we haven't received any Pastoral applicants yet. The Synod is waiting for First English & Zion to come to an agreement (which will be voted on in January) before they list our MSP. We will have the agreement on our website so that the congregation can read it before voting on it at the annual meeting. When it gets put on the website, Jon will do a Temple Talk explaining what's going on.

Approval of Boards (minus Christian Ed) taking responsibility for a month of Coffee Fellowship – The Board members do not need to serve coffee, they just need to find volunteers. Christian Ed is responsible for finding Sunday School volunteers each Sunday so they are excluded. The snacks will be cookies for both the adults and Sunday School children. The board of Lay Ministry will start in January, Evangelism will take on February, Youth & Family Ministry will do March, Stewardship will do April, and Church Properties will do May. Where will the money come from to pay for it when we deficit spend? The Executive Committee decided on something but forgot. - Michelle, Glenn MSP.

Board of Evangelism – Jane Debner Reported – The giving box will be left in the office during the week and there's a note by the tree directing people to the office during the week. The board will try to put in an article about the Christmas & New Years' service in the newspaper instead of an ad to try to save money. Marge Dragseth will talk with Barbara to get the times of the services and will also get the annual report done. Marge will visit Liz concerning the amount of money spent on the publications. The giving tree will be taken down January 1st, 2025.

The board wondered if confirmation students could be a part of the services at Fairway View. It's pretty easy to find one person to do the FWV services (unless it's a couple). But there should be more than one person helping with the service. Can that be a service act for the confirmation students? Yes. In the case that someone signed up to be there and doesn't show, FELC might be letting down FWV members. Someone has to be able to handle that service at the last minute in case of no shows. The Board of Evangelism would be responsible for this. It already is an option for students to choose to help greet or help with FWV services. They would need to be required to sign up for FWV to force them to volunteer. It's not required this year. It could be required for confirmation students next year. In this case, it was discussed that it would be good for the confirmation students to go up to Fairway View and receive instructions. The board is looking for two replacements.

Transfer out of Denise & Kevin Fossen - Marge, Jane MSP.

Christian Education – Sara Wollschlager Reported – Sara will do the annual report. The board will use the same budget as last year. This year the board will be losing two members and has three new possibilities in mind. Sunday School will resume January 12th and will pick up in the lessons where they left off. The board wants to update and organize the supply closet. Board members will throw out old supplies and buy new ones. The Zupfers will be contacted about the Sunday School kids singing in church in 2025. The Christmas Program is next week. Someone will talk with Marilyn Chindvall to see if an extra practice may be needed, possibly on Wednesday after school. There will also be a bake sale that day that Kaitlyn is putting together. The congregation is invited to Sioux Historic for a free family skating on January 5th from 10:00 – 1:00 pm. All ages are welcome. Pizza will be served. This is only for our congregation this year, not knowing the costs of how many would show up and Zion will be having their service during this time. No one invited Zion.

Youth & Family – Alan Hodenfield Reported – Because there's no large youth trip planned the board is going to go back to the 2022/2023 budget. Board members are working on their annual report and it will be submitted by the due date. Students from Zion continue to come to confirmation/youth group. There were 24 students at youth group last week. Katelyn is organizing the bake sale for Sunday. Thank you, Katelyn. If anyone is baking and would like to donate extra treats, that would be appreciated.

Stewardship – Julie Schneider Reported – The Stewardship annual report is completed and will be emailed to Barbara. The budget for 2025 will be \$625 which is close to the board's actual spending for 2024. It was reduced because of financial issues. There will be a change in how the payroll reimbursement from Zion will be reported, down at the bottom instead of up in the receivables. The dedication of stewardship pledges will be on January 5th. The board is not losing any members. The Pastor / Agreement is fine with some changes as previously discussed. Stewardship's Good News will talk about the Christmas Services (and times), Cantata, Children's Christmas Program and the pastoral agreement for another 6 months.

Church Properties – Glenn Henningson Reported – The back hallway is completed except the carpet. FELC has had checks for that; we'll cash them and hold on to the money until spring. The board doesn't want to put new carpet down in case it starts leaking again. The budget hasn't been completed yet.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl presented her report (via email/document) to the council detailing her activities, such as 2 funerals (Zion), and her past special services (Election Day, and Thanksgiving). She's been attending WAM meetings. She is planning on a special Blue Christmas service (for those who mourn) at FELC on Dec. 21st and she plans to lead our FELC Christmas Eve service at 2:30 pm and also lead the Zion Christmas Eve service at 4:30 pm. She held a Hanging of the Greens service at FELC on December 8th. She is working on streamlining services for the two congregations for January. Starting January 5th Pastor Cheryl will be starting to lead both FELC (9:00 am) & Zion (10:30 am) on the same day. January Confirmation classes will start up again on the 8th. Come January she will be planning to work at FELC Mondays (from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm), at Zion Tuesdays (10:00 am to 4:00 pm), at FELC Wednesdays (10:00 am to 3:30 pm & 5:30 to 7:00pm), at FELC Thursdays (10:00 am – 4:00 pm). Thursday is generally the day she does visitations. Sundays, she plans to be at church 8:00 am to about noon.

Jon adjourned the meeting and Pastor Cheryl led the council in the Lord's Prayer.

Next council meeting will be on Sunday, January 12th after church services.

CHANGES IN WORSHIP SERVICES in JANUARY

As we go forward in the partnership between First English and Zion Lutheran, there will be several changes and adjustments made to our worship services.

SUNDAY MORNING WORSHIP:

The time of service will change for Zion Lutheran from 9 am to 10:30 am on Sundays. First English worship services will remain at 9 am with the KDIO radio broadcast continuing live during their service. For First English, this means the pastor will need to leave before the end of the service to travel to Zion and be ready for worship at 10:30. A leader will complete the dismissal and end of service. There will be a few changes to their order of service at First beginning with:

- Sharing of the peace this will move to the end of the service and prior to the dismissal and closing hymn allowing everyone to greet each other before they leave as the pastor will leave at this time and not be greeting them.
- Announcements they will be moved to the end of the service after the sharing of the peace
- Welcome will be brief and only announce the KDIO sponsors of the day

It is important to devote ourselves to worship each week with all that our tradition has provided but we must also be aware of others who are waiting to worship in our partnership congregation so the pastor can be on time for them as well. Timing is important and the services will adjust as needed.

COMMUNION:

As a compromise, the Lord's Supper will be held every other Sunday (including 5th Sunday which happens once a quarter) beginning with the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month in January. The 5th Sunday month would then flip the communion from the 1st and 3rd to 2nd and 4th at times. This will be a trial period to reevaluate to establish if anyone is being excluded. Those dates will be:

Communion Services in January: the 5th and 19th.

Communion Services in February: the 2nd and 16th.

Communion Services in March: the $2^{nd}-5^{th}$ (Ash Wed) $-16^{th}-30^{th}$ (a 5-week month)

Communion Services in April: the 13th – 20th (Easter) – 27th

Communion Services in May: the 11th – 25th

Communion Services in June: the $8^{th}-22^{nd}$ (5-week month flips July back to 1^{st} and 3^{rd})

SEASON OF LENT AND EASTER SERVICES:

Each congregation will hold services on Ash Wednesday as follows:

5:30 at Zion

6:30 at First English

During Lent and the three days, services will rotate between First English and Zion.

These services will all begin at 6 pm. The rotation goes as follows:

March 12th – 6 pm at First English

March 19th – 6 pm at Zion

March 26th – 6 pm at First English

April 2nd – 6 pm at Zion

April 9th - 6 pm at First English

April 17th - Maundy Thursday – 6 pm at Zion

April 18th – Good Friday - 6 pm at First English

Easter Sunday Services will be at the regular times with the addition of Sunrise service:

7 am at First English

9 am at First English

10:30 at Zion

All things can be evaluated. Remember, Jesus did not establish the church or give direction on how the service should be held. Many things are man-made traditions, and we have the option to worship our Lord in Spirit and truth in many and great ways.

Starting in January, Pastor Cheryl's office hours will change. On Mondays, she will be at First English from 10 am to 4 pm. On Tuesdays, she will be at Zion Lutheran Church from 10 am to 4 pm. On Wednesdays, she will be at First English from 10 am to 3:30 pm (and then teaching confirmation). On Thursdays, she will be at First English from 10 am to 4 pm. Thursdays are usually her day to visit members. As always, she will be available by appointment as needed.
