Notes from Pastor Cheryl



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" Psalm 133:1

This past Sunday was a challenging day for the congregations of First English and Zion Lutheran as they held their annual meetings and voted to work together through a partnership agreement. I've written before about how change is difficult and over the last few months there has been a great deal of work to address those things that needed to happen.

Through the challenges, you have seen how God promised to be there for those who share the gospel. As you move forward, be encouraged by the words of the Apostle Paul who wrote to the Philippians: *"I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ."* (1:6)

For those who have faith in the Spirit to lead, you can trust God to provide when you are doing His will. You will accomplish great things in His name "for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure." (Phi 2:13)

With the partnership agreement approved, work together now begins with the process to call a pastor who will serve both churches. Each church remains independent and responsible for their own property, mission, and ministry. There will be a joint partnership committee that meets often to oversee new challenges that arise and a combined call committee to work through the calling of a pastor. So challenges continue as we all learn to work together.

As you go forward, continue to seek to do the will of God, pray for guidance, and listen for His word to inspire and direct your paths. God will not abandon you as promised in Psalm 37:

- ³ Trust in the LORD, and do good; so you will live in the land, and enjoy security.
- ⁴ Take delight in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.
- ⁵ Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him, and he will act.
- ⁶ He will make your vindication shine like the light, and the justice of your cause like the noonday.
- ⁷ Be still before the LORD, and wait patiently for him; do not fret over those who prosper in their way, over those who carry out evil devices.

Being the church at this time is difficult, with low numbers of available pastors, declining church attendance, decreasing financial support, more people declaring they are unaffiliated with a church, greater affluence, and many societal outside influences. I encourage you to commit your way to the Lord and trust in Him. Don't doubt but have faith God will provide as He has through this process. You already have proof in the work done of how God has been with you to help you go forward and you can use that same trust in the coming months.

^{*5}May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, ⁶so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ." (Romans 15)

In the same way, the families of First English and Zion Lutheran can come together in kindness and caring for each other, to experience the joy of belonging, and Christ's love through the love of others with a feeling of enthusiasm and confidence.

As you go forward, although independent, consider your partner congregation in planning which allows your pastor to be involved with both and your members to be in fellowship with each other. As a new pastor is called, as always, there will be changes. Embrace them.

Find innovative and creative ways to work together for the common good and the body of Christ. Use your talents, gifts, thoughts, and time to work as the family of God. Put negative thoughts to the side as Matthew writes *"But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."* (6:33)

Some things will be as they have been in the past, but there will new ways from those things you have always done. Let those new traditions become ways to see what God is up to and then join in. It may fill you with a renewed Spirit and deeper faith.

Nothing is accomplished with fear, doubt, and a negative attitude. God provides encouragement, courage, wisdom, creativity, and promise throughout scriptures. Spend time in His words and open your heart to a God who answers, and a God who provides. Then go forward in Him.

"Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful." (Colossians 3: 15)

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes January 12, 2025 (not yet approved)

Members present: Jon Anderson (president), Ellie Helgeson (vice president) and *Lay Ministry*, Becky Parker (treasurer) *and Stewardship*, Kaitlyn Burdorf – *Christian Education*, Archer Dorry – *Youth & Family*, Glenn Henningson – *Church Properties*, Darin Ehrenberg – *Stewardship*, Michelle Bauer – *Lay Ministry*.

Meeting was called to order by President Jon Anderson at 10:41 am.

Approval of both December Council Minutes as presented –Michelle, Becky MSP.

Approval of Treasurer's Report - Darin, Glenn MSP.

Board of Lay Ministry – Michelle Bauer Reported – The board approved the WAM minutes and talked about salary increases at the last meeting. The board believed the Christmas service was not over-crowded. Josh Wollschlager will join the Endowment Committee. A request was put into the Endowment Committee to cover the cost of cookies.

Board of Evangelism – *No one was there at the council meeting to report for the board of Evangelism.*

Christian Education – Kaitlyn Burdorf Reported – Sunday School Program started up again today (1/12). The board will go through the supply closet this month and give Liz a list of supplies that are needed. The board believes the Christmas Program went well. In 2025 the children may sing in the church service March 23rd and April 13th but they still have to discuss this with Carmen. The early bird discount deadline for Green Lake Bible Camp is ending soon. The board plans to partner with Zion for VBS this year, but no further planning has occurred. Ashley will reach out to Sara Tollakson. Someone asked about having Affirmation of Baptism (Confirmation) in the spring rather than the fall on Reformation Sunday. Pastor Cheryl was okay with doing it at either time. Christian Education is in favor of moving it. There was discussion concerning both Zion & FELC having youth in confirmation classes and that with the partnership agreement both churches will have to agree about which day it is. This has to be brought up at a partnership meeting if we are going to change it. Fun was had by all at the roller-skating event. We had 39 from First English and 9 from Zion. The board plans to have another skating event next year, but they may do it at a different time with Sunday School and then skating afterward. We had to pay \$450 to have the event. There was a question as to whether Zion paid for anything. When you signed in you got different color tickets depending on which church you were with.

Youth & Family – Archer Dorry Reported – The board raised \$692 from the Christmas bake sale. The board will continue to explore other ideas for the summer trips/events and will start to advertise for the Superbowl Subs soon, but will raise all of the prices by \$1 due to the rising costs of groceries. The board will continue to work with Zion. There was discussion on whether or not the Zion youth could be a part of the Sub fundraiser.

Stewardship – Darin Ehrenberg Reported – The board will continue with the same local benevolence as last year. The board discussed changing the way we show funds in the bulletin. In addition to a month-to-month, we'll show a cumulative revenue and expense, to help show if we're ahead or behind for the year. We only need about \$20/week per giving family unit to make our budget. The pink giving envelopes will stay the same.

There was discussion on the donation pledge box that sits at the front of the sanctuary. The envelopes are never opened. The pledges are between each family and God alone. Sunday School does sometimes donate, but it's not collected in a box, it's a bucket. The Sunday School donations stay in the church funds. The noisy offering goes to help 3 South African Students. They are recorded as two different funds.

The Good News Newsletter will include blurbs about the Adults-Only Game Night, the annual meeting, and perhaps the good news that you don't have to give an arm & a leg to support our budget. If you took our proposed budget, \$227,443, add 15% to it, that's how much we need this year to break even. If you divide it by 235 (available-to-give) units, it's \$1,113 for the year. It's \$21.40 a week. That's not counting members out of state or in Fairway View with no ability to give.

We are not ordering more giving envelopes compared to last year. We have extras in case a family needs one. More people are consistently giving online, which lowers how many envelopes are needed.

Church Properties – Glenn Henningson Reported – The board came up with a list of completed items over the past year which included: replacement of outdoor security lights, the repair & replacement of damaged bell tower ceiling and walls, replacement of one air conditioning unit at main entrance, repair & replacement of cross on the bell tower, repair to the narthex roof, and the addition of a new water fountain. There is now an Allen wrench by the door for lock up during the evenings.

Review the benevolence percentages. No changes to the percentages were recommended.

2025 proposed budget discussion – There was discussion on whether or not to budget a specific amount for benevolence when we do not know what our general *(designated offerings are not included)* offerings will be for 2025. Since we do not know what we will bring in, we cannot know what 15% of that will be which makes it impossible to know what specific amount it will be by the end of 2025. Our monthly expenses shown in the bulletin include that 15% because we give to benevolence monthly. If you look at the monthly income shown in the bulletins, 15% of that was already spent on benevolence. We have never budgeted revenue. The council had a consensus to keep it at 15%.

There was also discussion on the youth budget, specifically the chaperone amount of \$4,000 which was seemingly the same as last years' *(there was a mistake in the proposed budget, but this was fixed for the annual report).*

We budgeted for 100% of a full time pastor last year and only got a part-time pastor at the end of the year, which was shared with Zion, cutting the expense further. This year, although Pastor Cheryl is full-time, the salary is shared with Zion, so we're only budgeting for 60% of a pastor in 2025. Not budgeting for 40% of a pastor is a good reduction in our budget.

Motion to approve the 2025 proposed budget with the contingency that we double-check the youth & family budget. Becky, Archer MSP.

Annual Meeting Agenda – the executive committee will look over last year's annual meeting agenda and revise it to be good for this year's meeting, adding the vote on the partnership agreement and the approval of the audit report.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl presented her report (via email/document) to the council detailing her activities, such as officiating Carol Barrett's funeral, and her past special services (Blue Christmas & Christmas Eve services). She has visited members at Fairway View. She attended the special Christmas luncheons with the Day of Love and Circle 4 groups, a WAM meeting, and staff meetings. She turned in an annual report. She went roller skating (after her Zion church

service) on Jan. 5th. January Confirmation classes started up again on the 8th. She is now working at FELC Mondays (from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm), at Zion Tuesdays (10:00 am to 4:00 pm), at FELC Wednesdays (10:00 am to 3:30 pm & 5:30 to 7:00pm), at FELC Thursdays (10:00 am – 4:00 pm). Thursday is generally the day she does visitations. Sundays, she plans to be at church 8:00 am to about noon. Pastor Cheryl is working on a few projects at this time, such as skits for the youth during our Lenten services, streamlining FELC & Zion services to become more similar, and arranging a speaker about addiction for the youth group on February 26th. She also mentors a student studying to become a pastor because she believes it's important to encourage more pastors. There is a possibility she may take time off in February although nothing's been planned as of yet.

The Annual Meeting of First English Lutheran Church was called to order by President, Jon Anderson. A quorum was declared. The Annual Congregational Meeting was opened with prayer by President Anderson. President Anderson asked the members present to review the following minutes:

A motion was made by Deb Henningson, seconded by Darin Ehrenberg to approve the minutes of the Annual Meeting – January 28, 2024 and the Annual Election Meeting – June 23, 2024. Motion carried. The following reports were presented –

- Treasurer's Report Presented by Julie Schneider, member of the Stewardship Board A motion was made by Marge Dragseth, seconded by Neva Foster to approve the Treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.
- Auditor's Report Presented by President Anderson The financial records were audited by Ethel Swenson and Marilyn Hanson and to them "thank you". It was noted that the auditors had made some insightful recommendations that they hoped would be reviewed by all boards. A motion was made by Julie Schneider and seconded by Marla Strei to approve the Auditor's Report as presented. Motion carried.
- President Anderson presented the Committee, Staff and Board Reports A motion was made by Liz Ketz, seconded by Neva Foster to approve the Committee, Staff and Board Reports as presented, Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

There were no Old Business items for discussion.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Green Lake Bible Camp delegates for the Annual Meeting Please contact the Church Office and let Barbara know if you are interested in attending. She will give you the necessary information for the meeting.
- Voting members to the LQP Conference Assembly Meeting February 23rd at 2:00 P.M. at Kviteseid Lutheran in Milan. We can take up to six voting members to attend, ideally three female and three male voting members. If you are interested in attending, please call Barbara at the Church Office.
- Voting members for Synod Assembly June 6-7th.This will be held at Gustavus Adolphus and we can send three members. If you are interested in attending the meeting as a delegate, please call Barbara at the Church Office.
- Julie Schneider, a member of the Stewardship Board, reviewed the Balance Sheet and presented the Financial Plan for 2025. When reviewing the Financial Report, a discussion ensued regarding the "Outreach" mission payments. These dollars have not been included under the expenses every year. She further explained that failure to include these expenses in our budget result in an unclear presentation of our total expenses.
- Ellie Helgeson, Lay Ministry reported that First English Lutheran's 60% share for the Pastor Partnership and expenses has been included in our 2025 budget. Following discussion, a motion was made by Darin Ehrenberg, seconded by Paula Reisdorf to approve the 2025 Financial Plan as presented. Motion carried.
- A motion was made by Julie Schneider and seconded by Kristi Ehrenberg that the "Outreach" mission expenses be included in our future expense budget. Motion carried.
- Liz Ketz, Financial Secretary and Dick Strei, Endowment Board Member presented the Endowment Report-

A motion was made by Scott Schneider, seconded by Kristi Ehrenberg to approve the authorization of Ameriprise Financial with Lindsay Sherritt as Financial Manager to continue the management of the Endowment Fund. Motion carried.

• A motion was made by Liz Ketz, seconded by Marge Dragseth to approve the Resolution regarding 5% of the corpus amount in the Endowment Fund and that it be authorized and available for distribution in 2025. Motion carried.

- President Anderson reported that we presently have in place our Interim Agreement and that we continue to work with the Synod and the Pastoral Call process.
- President Anderson then presented the Partnership Agreement with Zion Lutheran Church. Discussion ensued. A motion was made by Jim Foster, seconded by Marge Dragseth that we approve the Partnership Agreement as presented. Motion carried.
- President Anderson and the members present closed the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.

Created for Community is theme of Midweek Lenten Services

The invitation to Lent spoken on Ash Wednesday reminds us that we enter this season together "with the whole church". It goes on to state that "we are created for communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation."

Though many common Lenten practices rightly invite us to individual acts of "repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love," Lent is also a time for deepening of community.

In the early church, the weeks before Easter were a time in which the whole community took responsibility for the training of confirmation students. Not only were the catechumens enriched by this formation, but those already within the community were strengthened in their faith along with them. This year's confirmation students will assist with the services each week.

Using readings from Mark's gospel, this series invites the assembly to reflect on what it means to be in community with one another, with the world, with creation, and with God. During the midweek services during Lent, the congregations of First English and Zion Lutheran will have time to reflect and respond to what it means to be community together through the readings, songs, and message.

Ash Wednesday service on March 5th will be held at each congregation with Zion holding service at 5:30 pm and First English at 6:30 pm. Midweek Lenten service will rotate between the two with services at 6 pm beginning with First English on March 12th and Zion at March 19th.
