The Heartbreak of Addiction - Ryan's Story Presentation

The Ryan's story presentation rescheduled from February will be held at 6 pm on Wednesday evening, April 23rd at First English Lutheran Church in Ortonville, MN. The presentation by Beth Koch St Martin of Milbank, SD tells the story of a family dealing with a child's addiction and the pain and grief in the loss of a loved one.

The purpose of Ryan's Story is to erase some of the stigma around drug addiction and help people understand it can happen to anyone. St Martin tells the story from the non-addict view and then talks about the pain of loss, how to cope with a child's death, and what she does to manage her grief.

With the increase of drugs across the country and younger children being exposed, this presentation provides an opportunity to hear this story in the hope that it may save another family the pain and grieve of losing a child through the heartache of addiction.
