Notes from Pastor Cheryl



May 29, 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Summer is Here!

We wait and wait – and finally... there it is, all bright and beautiful.

I don't know about you, but it seems summer goes by ALL too quickly. I just barely get the garden planted, the flowers potted... and wham... we are well into summer and in no time at all, summer comes to an end.

I enjoy the 4 seasons we have in this part of the country. Autumn comes with its beautiful crisp air. Spring has that marvelous smell of fresh dirt and rain. I would miss not having winter and looking out at the silent glistening snow. Scripture has at least 40 references about seasons. The most famous Ecclesiastes 3: 1-8 that starts with:

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven."

Matthew Henry Commentary tells us that in writing this Solomon had found there was no happiness in schools of learning, philosophical thought, pleasures of the world, or anything of human affairs. All is vanity. For everything in the world is changing in what he calls the wheel of nature. Once, the spoke of the wheel is uppermost and prominent, and at another, not, as the wheel turns. That is the same as seasons change.

First English and Zion Lutheran are in a season of change. Organizing one Vacation Bible School experience last year. Combining confirmation in a program of study. Working together to form a partnership. And now, calling a pastor. A changing season is in the air.

Solomon writes how we live in a world of change where events may be very different one to another but our humanness believes we pass between the changes, the seasons, as if everything should remain the same. The clearest sky does not stay cloudless, and the most clouded sky will clear up.

Those things that seem to be stable and trustworthy to us promptly can change because there is a divine power that determines its purpose. Everything is changeable because of the wisdom and knowledge of God, for it is He who changes the time and seasons of the earth... and of our lives.

The prophet Daniel says about God, "He changes times and seasons. He sets up kings. He removes them from power. The wisdom of those who are wise comes from him. He gives knowledge to those who have understanding." (2: 21)

At this time of year, we accept the change of season that comes and trust it will have a good result as we move from the spring rains to the summer sun. As we watch our young people graduate, we accept they will go on to learn, to grow, to fail at times, and to succeed. As we watch gardeners' plant and farmers sow the seeds of fields, we trust there will be a season of harvest.

We have also seen storms blow through and take that harvest or drought dry up the chance for a bountiful crop. Yet we believe everything will remain the same and result in a harvest.

Proverbs 3 teaches: "⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. ⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. ⁷ Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the LORD, and turn away from evil. ⁸ It will be a healing for your flesh and a refreshment for your body."

Scripture tell us to Trust... not in our self.

Trust the clouds will return on a sunny day. Trust the summer will follow after the spring rains. And trust our Lord will be with us as First English and Zion continue to journey together in partnership.

There will be change in the wheel of nature as the world goes spinning around, for a spoke that once was prominent may become less so... and the things that were less prominent may become the uppermost importance for our faith family.

Allow the change for as Jeremiah reminds us: "For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. (29:11)

To be submissive to God's plan is to be willing to trust in Him and allow for that change to grow for His purpose. It does not mean what has always been done was wrong or not good enough, but God is taking us to a new relationship or developing a relationship with others.

Solomon goes on to say, "I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; (Ecc 3:12) He is saying, we must make the best of what we have and are given while it last. Wait in patience, pleased with our lot in the world and cheerfully adapt to the talents, abilities and limitations of our faith family.

This is where we are. Once the membership was much larger and our congregations could do as they wanted without consideration or communication with the other. That spoke has moved around as the wheel of nature has turned.

So "¹⁸ Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. ¹⁹ I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43)

As the summer seems to suddenly be upon us, so has change come. Not everything will stay the same, but not everything will be different. Trust in God's plans for you in this partnership, do not rely on your own understand, and allow God to make a way in your wilderness.

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes May 11, 2025 (not yet approved)

Members present: Jon Anderson (president), Becky Parker (treasurer) and *Stewardship*, Archer Dorry – *Youth & Family*, Glenn Henningson – *Church Properties,* Paula Reisdorph – *Evangelism*, Michelle Bauer – *Lay Ministry*, Amanda Stattelman – *Christian Education.*

Meeting was called to order by President Jon Anderson at 10:30 am.

Approval of April Council Minutes as presented - Becky, Paula MSP.

Approval of Treasurer's Report – We fell behind this month a little. Our month to date & cumulative offerings are better than last years, but costs are going up. There was more than usual spent under "Substitute Secretary" because Barbara was sick for over a week. Liz filled in. We are gathering money in MinnWest checking. Michelle, Amanda **MSP.**

Board of Lay Ministry – Michelle Bauer Reported – The board accepted the WAM minutes (and they will go with Pastor Cheryl's recommendation to keep the Favorite Hymn days on the 4th Sundays rather than switching them to the 5th Sundays in June & August). The Senior gift crosses are ordered. Ellie will pick them up and present them on Sunday. Cody is checking with people on the tech desk to see if anyone would be willing to train for that. The board tabled the WAM job description discussion until the full board was together. The board approved the summer hours for Pastor Cheryl & Barbara. The ushers no longer want to usher for funerals, which is okay because the funeral home will provide ushers. The board should let the funeral home know that if they need extra they can contact us to find some helpers.

Board of Evangelism – Paula Reisdorph Reported – There are no transfers in or out. The board plans on holding the monthly hymn sings the same 2nd Wednesday each month that Pastor does a communion service. They would hold it right after her service on June 11th, July 9th, & August 13th. For Mother's Day, the board gave flowers to the mothers/mother figures/etc. Deb Henningson will join the board. Jane Debner & Marla Strei will stay on. The board has some names of visitors who wrote on friendship pads who they are reaching out to. The Twins Game bus is full. Zion is having youth nights June 18th, July 16th, and August 20th. The board of Evangelism wants to do an outdoor game night with that. The board also wants to have a pool party on July 20th or Aug. 3rd. The board will rent the pool and the date will be finalized in June. The board would prefer not have the council meeting on Mother's Day.

Board of Christian Education – Amanda Stattelman reported – There are no delegates for the Annual Synod Assembly. The board reviewed the Annual Planning Schedule from Pastor Cheryl and noticed some things that are probably going to have to change. The Christmas Program was scheduled on December 21st and the board believed that no one would be there because that's when a lot of people are celebrating with their families (the week of Christmas). The board proposes that the Christmas Program be moved back to Dec. 14th. There are a bunch of kids registered for VBS and volunteers have been meeting with Zion to prepare. Christian Education didn't know whether or not they were supposed to order gifts for seniors. They found a couple of options. Sometimes in the past, Christian Education & Lay Ministry have gone together on a gift so they will do that this year. There was an idea of a book of prayers for situations that arise when you're a young adult. There was a budget of \$25/kid. That may be a good idea for next year.

While preparing for next year's Sunday School, the board discussed the possibility of the mentors and mentees being required to teach one Sunday School class as part of their requirements because they are struggling to find volunteers to teach SS classes. If they can't get volunteers, then they propose having Sunday School once a month instead of every Sunday. It was mentioned that in the past, Pastor Denise was asked if the confirmands could get sermon notes credit for teaching Sunday School and she said, "no." It may be difficult to get the youth to do this. Beth Fladhammer said she will join the board. There was discussion on using Zoom to get members' input without them having to attend the council meetings in person. It was unknown at the meeting if we had a Zoom account. (We paid for a year account so FELC has a paid Zoom service until January of next year). This can be explored in the fall.

Youth & Family – Archer Dorry Reported – No one from the board can attend the Synod assembly. The board of Youth & Family would prefer the council meetings be moved to Wednesday evenings because there are no school events or sports that day. Kaitlyn is working on summer events. Jennifer Anderson, Lorraine Conroy, and Mary Athey have graciously agreed to join the board. Kari Dorry is leaving.

Stewardship – Becky Parker Reported – Darin's term is up, but he wants to continue. There is a lot for Pastor going on Wednesdays, the board though the 2nd Monday might be a better time for the council meeting. No one is interested in the Synod Assembly. May's Good News will be about our graduates, Mother's Day, VBS coming up and that the Call Committee's work has begun.

Church Properties – Glenn Henningson Reported – Spring cleanup is planned for tomorrow. We have a mandatory elevator upgrade for 2026. The whole elevator upgrade could be around \$80k. We have the option of upgrading via piecemeal so the costs would not have to be all at once. We have other bids

coming in from different companies. The board will work on figuring out if someone can raise the cement in the sidewalk.

Jon brought up deciding on the next council meeting. The next council meeting was scheduled for June 8th but that was recently scheduled as a joint worship service at Zion. If the council meeting was that day the council members would have to drive to FELC after worship to have the council meeting. It was decided to have it on Father's Day (6/15) the next Sunday by consensus. The final decision on the fall council meetings would be decided June 15th. If the council was on Wednesdays, it would have to be between 5:30 and 7 due to Pastor Cheryl having confirmation classes, and council members (and Pr. Cheryl) having choir at 7. Also, in the fall, the youth group will be back where the council usually meets. Pastor Cheryl should be asked for her preferences before the council votes.

Green Lake Ministries contacted the church to help with their fundraising. Someone can contact them to see if they want to pitch it to the church on a Sunday.

The council should be given the Joint Committee meeting minutes prior to the council meeting if possible. The last joint meeting discussed how well the Lenten services went, especially with the youth being involved and in the future we will plan to use the same rotating method for Lent/Holy Week. The committee discussed attempting to get a youth director who can work more hours (and in the summer as well) not to get rid of Kaitlyn (and she could apply to this position if we offered it), but it would be best to have someone around more often to work with the youth (7th to 12th grade) related activities. Although the costs would be split with Zion, we will have to figure out if our churches can afford to hire someone for this position. We are already paying for some youth duties to Kaitlyn and Liz, so we would need to know how much of that is already being covered and revisit this. The joint committee also discussed an idea of rotating which church the service would be in the summer months but decided against it. Our joint agreement spells out the service times. June 8th we will have a joint service at Zion to kick off VBS. And one Sunday in August (3rd) Zion will come to FELC. The call committee had their training May 4th at Zion. Both call committees have agreed to interview Pastor Cheryl (May 21st) with an eye towards calling her. If the committees say, "yes" then we will be calling her. The synod reiterated that they do not believe it's fair to consider other leaders before deciding on her (now that she's applied). After the interview the call decision has to go before the FELC-Zion joint call committee and they have to approve, then it goes to each individual church councils and they have to approve the call, and then it goes to each church congregation and they would all have to approve the call. No matter what, this process cannot happen before FELC's annual congregational meeting (June 22nd) and we will have to extend Pastor Cheryl's interim agreement in June. If only one group from either church disapproves to her call then we have to start looking at other pastors.

Approval of \$400 offering to the SW MN Synod. Becky, Glenn MSP.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Cheryl presented her report (via email) to the council detailing her activities, such as being called to the school for a crisis (Alexis' death), working with the youth on May Day baskets, planning services, and putting together an annual planning schedule for both congregations. She is working on a Senior Recognition service, summer youth nights at Zion (June 18th, July 16th, & August 20th), a Sunday Youth Service, Confirmation New testament classes for the fall, and Summer Evening Bible Study. The speaker for Ryan's Story was well attended by students and adults. She will be travelling to Gustavus Adolphus in St. Peter to attend the Synod Assembly June 6th-7th. She will be officiating a memorial service, June 15th, for Norma Buhault beginning at 1 pm at Mound Cemetery and then on to Eidskog. June 18th she plans to be at the Youth night at Zion. On June 21st there is a memorial service for Richard Verheul at 11 am at FELC. She will be going on the MN Twins Trip with the FELC & Zion members June 26th.

President Jon Anderson Adjourned the meeting at 11:27 am.

Next council meeting will be on Sunday, June 15th, after church services.

FELC-ZION PARTNERSHIP BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes - April 30, 2025 (not yet approved)

Attendance: Pr. Cheryl, Jerry Reupke, Sara Tollakson, Jeremy Tollakson, Ellie Helgeson, Jon Anderson, Kristen Ohm, Becky Parker

Meeting was called to order by Chairman Reupke and Pastor Cheryl led us in prayer,

MSP Jon/Jeremy to approve the minutes of the February 5, 2025 meeting with two spelling corrections.

Pastor provided her in-depth report which included all activities for this year that she has worked on at both churches and also a working/planning document for all activities for the coming year. Two activities were listed but were not on the schedule as yet, FELC's Just for the Love of It Supper(s) that will be scheduled by their Evangelism Board and the Zion potlucks.

Pastor asked our congregations to consider hiring a half-time youth director that would serve both congregations. Her proposal included possible duties and estimated costs and cost shares. This position would be for 20 hours per week and handle activities for 7-12th grade students. Liz already does help with youth activities and is paid and Kaitlyn gets paid for approximately 3 hours per week so those duties would be included in this position. Council members thought it was

important and a great idea. We will discuss it with our boards and continue to explore this possibility. We hoped if feasible we could implement by the fall.

All council members thought our Lenten/Easter season services, how we worked together, confirmation student involvement, the theme and alternating locations worked very well. Ironically, food was one of the biggest challenges, how many to prepare for. After discussion, we concurred that we would do the same alternating schedule as last year. Having one joint Thanksgiving service at Zion on the Monday of Thanksgiving week was discussed. First English will take this to our board to consider. Not having it on Wednesday would alleviate the absence of people that leave town for the holiday. It was mentioned that it would be nice if the FELC Choir sang.

Fairway View Hymn sings are held monthly in the summer by First English and there was a suggestion to have Zion do one monthly also because the residents really like them and it does not require any additional Pastoral time.

Alternating locations for services in the summer was discussed, but it was determined that we would continue with service times and locations on Sunday as they are currently being held.

It was agreed to have a combined service on June 8 at Zion as a kickoff for VBS. As we did last year, combined service will be held at First English on August 3rd.

When asked about how the partnership works, two items, time complaints, though not many, and how hard it is to do Sunday School were voiced. Attendance and teacher volunteers are a struggle for both congregations. Otherwise, financially it is beneficial for both congregations and Pr. Cheryl continues to help us stay abreast of the activities of both parishes.

The Call Process is being initiated with joint training of our call committees this coming Sunday, the 4th. If we don't have a vote or a call by June 30th, we will need to extend Pr. Cheryl's interim contract.

A question was raised about who provides the meals for the youth group on Wednesday evenings. Historically, parents have been asked to donate meals.

Coffee fellowship was discussed.

Next Meeting will be held on August 12th at 5:30 p.m. at Zion. A special meeting will be held if we need to address a call in the meantime.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

Seventh graders are asked to use their imagination to create a visual medium that helps provide a better understanding of who Jesus is or what it means when Jesus ask, "Do you love me?" They cannot

The eighth graders are to use a standalone cross at least 12" high from a variety of materials. They must consider what the cross means to them personally and what difference it makes to them in their own life as a Christian.

Both grades must write an explanation about their project and why they created what they did.

9th graders write a statement of faith for their Confirmation Day in October.
