Notes from Pastor Cheryl

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Ready or not - Here I come" - says September.

Exciting new things are happening in September

I was thinking of how as a child you play hide and seek and once in a while, you hide and then change your mind or think of a better place to hide and start to go for it just to hear those words – "Here I come" - and then...! You quickly must decide, do I stay in my hiding spot or run to the new one?

Psalm 61:4 tells us: "You are a hiding place for me; you preserve me from trouble; you surround me with shouts of deliverance."

So, in faith, we are deciding to try a new spot as we put our summer activities away and get back into the routine of school, work, and fall events... of which there are many... ready or not, it is time to come out of hiding.

"Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast." (Psalm 139 7-10)

WORSHIP SERVICES:

To start off the month will be "God's Work Our Hands" Sunday, September 7th in both congregations. The services will be shortened to give everyone time to go out and do God's work before getting back together for a meal. There will not be communion on the first Sunday due to the shortened service. Additional information is in this month's newsletter

The second Sunday of September is Rally Sunday and Youth Sunday. As our children and young people return to Sunday school and regular worship, the 14th will be a day dedicated to them and their activities. At First English, the Sunday school will take their annual trip to Lac qui Parle refuge following the service. At Zion, the children will be playing bingo with the adults for a fun activity prior to service. The Youth from both churches will lead the services on the 14th. Archer Dorry will preach at both congregations and youth will serve as readers, ushers, acolytes, and communion assistance. Pastor Cheryl will preside.

On September 21st, the third Sunday, there will be Bible presentations and teacher installation to add to the worship service. There will not be communion on the third Sunday. A baptism is schedule for First and Acolyte training after worship at Zion.

Installation of Pastor Cheryl will be held on September 28th at both congregations. To allow more time for the service, communion, and Rev. Seyward to get to Zion Lutheran, services at Zion will start at 11 am.

COFFEE WITH THE PASTOR

New in September at First English there will be coffee set up in the narthex before church. The Evangelism team thought it would be a good time for fellowship for any who'd like to come a little early and since I am unable to stay following the service, it gives me an opportunity to visit with members. You are welcome to bring your own mug with a lid and take it into church. I hope to see you there.

SUNDAY SCHOOL CHANGES:

First English will make some changes to the Sunday school program beginning on September 21st. The children will be dismissed following the children's message each week. The plan is to "go back to the basics, bible stories, memory work, craft station, game station, skip snack, and include memory verses."

The reason for this change is to increase Sunday school attendance and find more volunteer teachers. This will affect the order of the worship service at First. Special music is moving forward prior to the readings to allow chorus members to teach and the readings to be together so the break in readings will not be a distraction. The placement of the Sacrament of Holy Communion in the order of service will change, but not in September. Communion will take place following the Installation.

CONFIRMATION:

The confirmation program will continue much like last year. Orientation is the last week of August this year so classes will begin Wednesday, September 3rd at 3:30pm for 7th and 8th graders and 4:30 pm for the 9th grade unless there is an early out and then the times are 1:45 and 2:45 pm respectively.

With the large number of students in 7th and 8th grade, parents are asked once again to take turns sitting in class to eliminate behavior problems. Members of both congregations are also asked to sign up for this service as several parents work and not able to take off this early. Please call the office at First to add your name as a volunteer for when a parent is unable to be there or to sign up on a specific date, especially on early out days. The sign-up sheet is on the bulletin board next to the office at First.

We also need people to be at First English from 4:30 to 5:30 pm as there is no one in the church to supervise the 7th and 8th graders and Pastor Cheryl is in class. If you can help in this way, please sign up.

Snacks have been allowed in the past for confirmation, and a sign-up sheet is available on the bulletin board next to the office at First English. Parents take turns for this, but any other members of either congregation can donate snacks for a week.

ACOLYTE TRAINING:

Acolyte Training for 7th and 8th graders at First English will be on Wednesday, September 3rd following confirmation. Liz Ketz will oversee the training beginning at 4:30 pm. Youngsters at Zion will have their acolyte training on Sunday, September 21st, following worship service.

YOUTH GROUP:

Pastor Cheryl will be working with the youth group until a youth group leader is found. Orientation/organization for youth in grade 7th through 12th will be from 5:30 to 6 pm on Wednesday, September 10th. The meeting will be short with snacks provided. Plans are to begin meeting on Wednesday, September 24th with a meal at 5:30 pm followed by an activity from 6 to 7 pm.

- Twice a month (1st and 3rd weeks) the group will have a discussion and study on a particular topic related to their world.
- On the 4th Wednesday of the month the group will stay at the church for an activity which could be playing board games, watching a movie, or having a speaker in.
- If there is a 5th Wednesday, they will have an activity of their choice, seniority preference for this time.
- The 2nd Wednesday of the month: Parents and other adults from both congregations are asked to volunteer as the group will have an activity outside of First English following their meal for drivers and supervision. (Pastor Cheryl will attend the First English Council meeting). Activities may be to go to Fairway View Neighborhood and play a game with the residents, go caroling, have an outside sports event, take a tour, or whatever the group and parents decide. Parents should contact Ronda Thielke or Pastor Cheryl to volunteer. Parent suggestions are welcome.

Meals for youth are on a volunteer basis, and a sign-up list is on the bulletin board next to the office at First. Parents and members take turns providing a meal for the youth each Wednesday.

Youth group is important for the continued faith-based growth of our young people. Parents are encouraged to support the program and have their children attend.

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH BOARD MEETING

Council Minutes - August 13th, 2025 (not yet approved)

Members present: Jon Anderson (president), Ellie Helgeson (vice president), Becky Parker (treasurer), Darin Ehrenberg - Stewardship, Mari Athey & Ashleigh Neuman- Youth & Family, Sara Wollschlager- Christian Education, Paula Reisdorph - Evangelism, Michelle Bauer & Emily Sigler- Lay Ministry, Dale Price - Church Properties, and Elizabeth Ketz- Secretary.

Meeting was called to order by President Jon Anderson at 6:07 pm. Pastor Cheryl led the devotions.

Approval of June Minutes as presented - Darin/Ashleigh MSP.

Approval of Treasurer's Report - Paula/Michelle MSP.

Board of Lay Ministry – Michelle Bauer & Emily Sigler– Ellie Helgeson will be the chair. There was no WAM, Endowment, or Finance report. At this time no one has applied for the Youth position but are willing to be more flexible with hours. Youth and Family will be responsible for the Sr Gifts. There is no need for a lay leader in October due to a change in Pastor's plans.

Board of Evangelism – Paula Reisdorph – Marla Strei and Paula Reisdorph will be the co-chairs for their board. Deb Henningson will be in charge of coffee before services in September and Marge Dragseth will do October to see how things go. Pool party was well attended 51 people came and a good time was had. The final Hymn Sing for the summer was held today. They were well attended. October 5th will be New Member Sunday. There are two families as of now that will be welcomed into the church on that date: Jackson and Taylor Athey and family and Betty Williamson. Transfer outs: Noah Zehringer and Keven Berdan. There are membership sheets available in Narthex. There is a Spanish pamphlet available in Narthex if we should have Spanish speaking visitors to explain FELC. There will be "Thanks for Popping In" packets for visitors and new members available in the Narthex. Magnets will be available on Rally Sunday for members to take. Evangelism will have a representative for confirmation interviews. Mission Sunday will be November 9th, and Day of Love will be talking about what they do and there will be a special offering held that day for them. Funds from the Giving Tree were distributed and given to various places on motion by Deb/Marge MSP.

Christian Education – Sara Wollschlager – Sara Wollschlager will be the chair. Carmen Zupfer is also on board. Will assign someone for each meeting to report. All the members of this board will take the training for insurance purposes with Protect My Ministry to cover Sunday School. Christian Ed will deal mostly with PreK-6 and Youth & Family will deal with 7-12. Rally Sunday will be on September 14th with activities to follow at the Refuge. Sunday School students will be dismissed following the Children's Message to go to class at approximately 9:30 and run until 10:15. Sunday School classes will start on September 21st and will use the same curriculum as last year. This Sunday will also be the Bible presentation on this date to 3 yr olds and 3rd graders. Sunday School will not be doing snacks this year. Date for singing in church to be determined and Christmas Program practice will begin in November. VBS went fine this year, but the numbers seemed to be down. This board advised trying to do it a week earlier next year so not to run into Summer Rec. conflicts. Christian Ed and Youth & Family will continue to work on setting the amount that families will be asked to pay for attending Bible Camp. Efforts will be made to set times for the fun events so that the Zion Youth can also participate without having to miss church or possibly explore joint services for that day.

Youth & Family – Mari Athey & Ashleigh Neuman – Archer Dorry will be the board's chair. Youth nights have been a good event for the youth over the summer. The final one will be on Wednesday, August 20th. Continue next year. Youth board agrees with continuing to assist families with Bible Camp fees and will be working with Christian Education to come up with what to ask the parents to provide cost wise in the next couple meetings. The Youth Board will be working on setting parameters of what being an active member of the Youth Group looks like in regard to the Scholarship given to Seniors at graduation time. The name going forward will be Youth Group. Fundraisers will continue to be Superbowl Subs, Easter Breakfast, Bake Sale, and Silent Auction along with looking at other options. National Youth Gathering will be June 28- July 2, 2027, in Minneapolis. Pastor and Ronda will handle the covenant night with the Youth Group. Synod Junior High Gathering is November 21-22, 2025, in Willmar. Families will need to step up to help with serving the meals for Youth Group and sitting in on classes during the 7-8th grade confirmation time. There will be sign-up sheets for both things, and they are open to any member of the congregation to sign up and help. Youth & Family along with Christian Ed will discuss next month opening the Youth Facebook page to entire congregation.

Stewardship – Darin Ehrenberg – Giving is down from last year by about \$8,000-\$9,000. Working on the theme for next year that coincides with the backpack theme of 'Come and Follow Me'. Mark Block suggested a possible auction as a fundraiser for the elevator upgrade to help keep our funds available for future needs. Stewardship will look more into this more. Also, some discussion on a "Life Skills Workshop" for our congregation at some point.

Church Properties – Dale Price – Dale Price will be the chair. Three bids were received for the elevator upgrade. The lowest bid was from TKE, who is our maintenance company also. The final bid was \$59,000.00 with extra charges for local electricians. The board is working on building a new platform for Pastor to stand on behind the altar. Window in Narthex is still being worked on as there are still a few issues there. Air conditioning is working but we will need to do an upgrade to the power vent in the future. There is an issue with condensation on the trunk line in the ceiling in the choir area. The vent needs to get wrapped to prevent dripping and molding. The bid from Larry's Refrigeration is \$2,968.76. There is still leaking from the Bell Tower, and the board is continuing to work on getting this issue corrected. The board also recommends that new office chairs be purchased for Pastor and the two-office staff. Pastor Cheryl provided information on proposed microphone/computer upgrade. A list of hardware/software inventory was compiled, Shure micro recommended, and proposed timeline for project completion by the beginning of June 2026 to coincide with joint worship at Zion Lutheran, providing a two-week window for installation and training.

Pastor's Report- Everyone received a copy of the Pastor's Report. Kaitlyn Burdorf submitted her resignation as Youth Director affective August 21st. A card was sent around for all the boards to sign thanking her for her service. Ronda Thielke will be coming in to discuss with Pastor how Youth Group will be run and when they will be meeting. This will help carry us over until we get a new Youth Director. There is a change in that Pastor will not be taking off the Sunday's reported in her report because of conflicts with other's schedules.

ALL BOARD ITEMS:

- Everyone looked over job descriptions (except Christian Ed) and are ok with what was printed
- Council will meet on the 2nd Wednesday of each month beginning at 5:30 PM for each individual board and the full Council Meeting (with all boards sending a representative) at 6:00 PM. Boards may meet ahead of this time and just send a representative to the full council meeting at 6:00 PM. This meeting will be held either in the Sanctuary or in the Narthex.
- Most groups agreed to give the coffee before the service option a try. The Evangelism Board is heading up the months of September and October to see how things go. This would only be coffee and no treats.
- Names submitted for help during installation service: Ellie Helgeson, Darin Ehrenberg, Amanda Stattelman. Other suggestions included Jon Anderson (who will be gone), Archer Dorry, Jyla Dahle.
- Liz Ketz will be working with the new mentors and the Board of Education to get the Protect My Ministry requirements completed.
- God's Work Our Hand Sunday will be run much like last year with volunteers signing up to do various activities. Amanda Stattelman has volunteered to do one activity, and Cody Backstrand will head up the Birthday Bags again. Other suggested activities included: Muffins for Public Servants, Headstone cleaning, Ditch clean-up (Youth and Families will head this up with the Youth Group).
- Pastor will keep everyone updated on Confirmation Interviews and invite each board to send a representative to be a part of it.

COUNCIL ACTIONS:

- Motion by Ellie/Michelle **MSP** to approve transfers in for Betty Williamson and Jackson & Taylor Athey Family and transfers out for Noah Zehringer and Keven Berdan.
- Motion by Darin/Becky **MSP** to approve request for \$2,968.76 to Larry's Refrigeration to Insulate main floor trunk to eliminate dripping in basement choir area.
- Dale/Darin **MSP** to accept TKE bid of \$59,000.00 plus local expenses to be determined for electrical to modernize the elevator to meet state codes.
- Dale/Becky MSP to allow the purchase of 3 new chairs for use in the Pastor's office and main office.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:38 PM.

Partnership Council Minutes – August 12th, 2025 – 5:30 p.m. at Zion (not yet approved)

Pastor led us in devotions and prayer based on Psalm 82.

The Council will need to meet prior to recommending a benefit package for Pastor at our council meetings in October. This will be for insurance and retirement benefits with salary decisions to come at budget time.

Pastor Cheryl will be installed at each congregation on Sunday, September 28. She has requested Zion to move their service to 11 a.m. just for that Sunday to accommodate a longer service.

Pastor Cheryl's activity report has been sent to councils. There is one addition of a Day of Love Mission emphasis on November 9.

Communion for September is on the 2nd and 4th Sundays due to God's Work Our Hands Sunday and Communion scheduled for the installation on the 28th.

It is imperative that each congregation strive to accommodate all youth in joint activities without interrupting their church attendance. Youth sharing activities is a priority.

No one has applied for the youth director position. Pastor thought we should consider making it more flexible with 15-20 hours. Pastor is considering staying and helping with youth activities after confirmation classes.

The group stressed how important it is to remain connected by activities, even if we are two congregations. We are proud of our progress in this partnership.

Next Partnership Council meeting will be on October 7, at 5:30 p.m. at FELC.


