CHRISTMAS EVE COLLECT

P: Let us pray... On this holy night, we welcome with joy the light of your life among us, Baby Jesus. Thank you for being the light of our lives every day. Shatter the darkness of sin and death. Break through the shadows of sadness. Reveal the warmth of your love. Let your brilliance shine through each one of us that we may show the world the power of your bright presence in and around us. Help us to always glow with your greatness and shimmer with your grace that more may come to your Light and be blessed by you. **C: Amen.**

NARRATIVE:

P: The nativity scenes during Advent are to represent this special – joyous night we celebrate. But it's hard to do that when the world is so dark... Not just because of the long nights and how close we are to the winter solstice. But because of the darkness of evil, hatred, and despair in the world today. It distracts us from the joy we should feel... The humble scene of the nativity with this young mother and helpless baby laying in a manger doesn't speak loud enough to draw us out of our brokenness. How do we find joy... where do we find hope in this darkness... and how do we feel loved... The nativity doesn't seem to give us that warm fuzzy feeling... amidst the fear... Or hope in the

despair... How can the light force back the darkness... when all we see are smirking faces... hear voices of discontent... and all around us are stressed and intolerant people... Where's the real Christmas story?

First Reading: Isaiah 9:2-7 (Lector) OT pg. 494

NARRATIVE:

P: The prophet Isaiah wrote that poem some 700 hundred years BEFORE Jesus was born. At the time, the world was a dark place after the massive destruction and fall of Israel. Israel did not hear... and would not listen to the prophets warning... The oppressed were broken down... judgement fell on those who refuse to accept God's word of promise... only a tenth of the descendants of the House of David survived the brutal attacks.

When Jesus was born... there was also darkness...It was a world where tyrants ruled forcing a census for sociopolitical control, soldiers killed because of culture or race, people were persecuted for their beliefs and thrown into slavery by corrupt courts. Everyone was distressed, in debt, living in fear, suffering and life was truly uncertain. That doesn't seem like a happy Christmas story of hope and love. Who could have known the birth of this baby would change the world?

CHRISTMAS CAROL: "Mary Did You Know" Jon Ydstie, soloist

NARRATIVE:

P: The gospel writings show total control over the people at the time. St Luke established Jesus in Bethlehem and continues the royal house of David amidst all this upheaval and poverty of God's people. Even through the corruption and violence, God's purpose was served by deceitful emperors and oppressive governments who were not even aware of it... The census required Joseph to return to his homeplace showing us how God is at work in our world... not just through miracles or blessed events... but God can use all things, including evil and chaos, as instruments to accomplish His will. ... Even through a babe born in a manger...

CHRISTMAS CAROL: 'What Child Is This?' (verses 1 & 2) #296

1. What child is this, who, laid to rest, on Mary's lap is sleeping? Whom angels greet with anthems sweet while shepherds watch are keeping? This, this is Christ the king, whom shepherds guard and angels sing; haste, haste to bring him laud, the babe, the son of Mary!

2. Why lies he in such mean estate where ox and ass are feeding? Good Christian, fear; for sinners here the silent Word is pleading. Nails, spear shall pierce him through, the cross be borne for me, for you; hail, hail the Word made flesh, the babe, the son of Mary!

NARRATIVE:

P: Luke writes in plain simple terms, bare of all decorations that would remove it from the lowly, poor, and marginalized of the earth The shepherds, the poorest and most outcast of society, are the first to hear the angel's announcement... the good news of joy and peace... not emperors or royalty... We see in this... how the good news is for all people, especially the poor... the oppressed... the downtrodden... as Jesus Himself came into the world as a child of the poor.

NARRATIVE:

P: Jesus placed His moral vision with the marginalized and oppressed people of the world beginning with the shepherd.

Shepherds tie us to the story of the shepherd king, David... and are on the guest list of the kingdom of God... as are the maimed, the blind, the lame...and all who are broken... The sheep... who hear the shepherds' voice... They wonder... they ponder... they are like us... Looking for answers... but struck by the awesomeness of this Savior... coming down to us for our salvation.

Bethlehem was a small, off the road and out of the way place... nothing that could ever boast of greatness. The stable was simple and bare, and the manager was an insignificant work of craftsmanship... nothing to brag about... That way there can be no claim... and no declaration of merit made by anyone involved in this miraculous event... Only the glory of God... floods the darkness... on this little town in Bethlehem...

- 1. O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by; yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light. The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.
- 2. For Christ is born of Mary, and, gathered all above while mortals sleep, the angels keep their watch of wond'ring love. O morning stars, together proclaim the holy birth, and praises sing to God the king, and peace to all the earth!
