Notes from Pastor Cheryl



July 30, 2026

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last month I talked about the upcoming Sr Mission Trip to Savannah, GA. It was a fantastic trip and great learning experience for those the participants: Archer Dorry, Kirby Olson, Bryson Karels, Brandon Kaye, Lexi Kaye, Cameron Anderson, and James Hodenfield along with chaperone/drivers Alan Hodenfield and Jennifer Anderson.

Before we left, a June gospel message in Matthew was about Jesus sending the disciples out without money, extra clothing, sandals, or staff with them.

Luke also writes “²And [Jesus] sent them out... ³“Take nothing for the journey,” He told them, “no staff, no bag, no bread, no money, no second tunic.” (9)

And Mark 6: 7-9 tells us: ... “and [Jesus] began to send them out two by two, ... ⁸He instructed them to take nothing but a staff for the journey—no bread, no bag, no money in their belts—⁹and to wear sandals, but not a second tunic.”

I reminded the youth that even though they felt they were taking little with them, in their need for one bag only restriction, they were taking a lot more than the disciples did. But they were taking one thing the disciples did have with them, that was trust.

As they were apprehensive, not knowing exactly what they would be doing, who they would meet, or what they would encounter, just as the disciples did, they would need to trust in God for the journey and feel His presence with them.

They all did an amazing job in their service as they stepped outside of their comfort zone, as many heard in their presentation on July 5th. Each took on their assignments without complaint or worry, and I heard great comments about what good workers they were. You all: parents, Sunday school teachers, youth leaders, congregational members, lay leaders, and former pastors can be very proud of the Christian influence you have had on them.

Our trip to Savannah was fast and furious, gathering at 5:30 am to head out for St Louis the first night, then drive the remaining distance the second, all with as few stops as possible. AND with bumper-to-bumper rush hour traffic through Atlanta, GA with an expert driver – Thanks Alan.

Meeting up with our other groups from Immanuel Lutheran Church of Atwater, MN and St Peters Evangelical Lutheran Church of Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, we were mixed in various groups to go out and serve over the next four and a half days.

Each day started with breakfast at 6:30 am and sent out with various others to our assigned project. The one place all served at one point was Savannah City Mission. There they helped prepare a meal, serve it, and clean up afterwards while others stocked the pantry and organized items in the thrift store.

Others served Habitat for Humanity cleaning up two properties and doing some landscaping work in extreme heat.

Some served at the (Extra Special People) ESP Summer Camp at the UGA Coastal Georgia Botanical Gardens working with youth and children with disabilities. The day was their final day at camp and a fun day of celebration and partying.

Another project was to Christ Church Episcopal, founded in 1733 as the first house of worship in the colony of Georgia. There we organized books for Operation Paperback, a Ministry of Christ Church: sending books to American Troops overseas who are in areas that have no electronic communications and request books to read. Books are donated to the church from various sources and we sorted by author to easily locate those requested.

Several were sent to the Riverview Nursing Home for a hymn sing, weeding around the grounds, and visiting with those who lived there.

On Sunday, we worked on a large landscaping project for the host church, the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, on Wilmington Island Rd in Savannah.

On Monday morning we delivered the 50 quilts the “Day of Love” quilters from First English Lutheran made for us to take to the Union Gospel Mission, where we received a tour of their facilities and learned of their extensive work. One of their houses is for women with children call the Magdalene House, where the quilts would be distributed.

The overall favorite of the group was attending worship at the First African Baptist Church. It is the oldest Black Church in North America, organized in 1773, and a National Historic Landmark that is registered with the National Register of Historic Places. After church, a college student and member gave us the history of the church which was originally called “First Colored Baptist”.

Another highlight was having the entire group worship on the beach by the ocean at Tybee Island Beach. Each night there were large group discussions and worship.

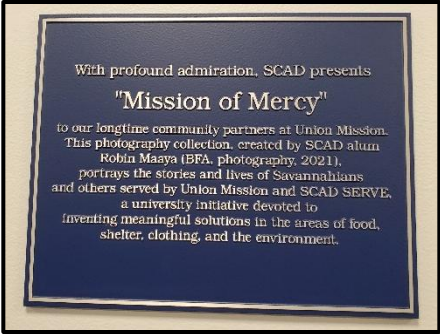
Our trip back was a little more relaxing as we stopped at the National Center for Civil and Human Rights and the Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historical Park in Atlanta.

We spent a day in Nashville touring the Grand Ole Opry and attending the evening concert as well as eating at the Aquarium Restaurant in the Opry Mall. And our last stop was at the Gateway Arches in St Louis. Running out of time, we just looked around but did not take the elevator to the top. (Everyone was getting anxious to get home).

We were not like the disciples in sacrifices they made traveling to proclaim the gospel message of Jesus. But the witness of these young people was just as sincere and true. They have learned much, and are ready to do it again, going to another location to serve others who are in need. And they are more aware of what being in mission for Christ is all about.

As the Apostle Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 5:20 “We are therefore Christ’s ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us.” We have been blessed by these young people, who were true ambassadors for Christ.

Parents & Students Confirmation Orientation set for 6 pm September 2

Parents of 7th to 9th graders and their student are required to attend this year's confirmation orientation on Wednesday, September 2nd beginning at 6 pm. *(NOTE Time!)*

Any high school age student who has not attended confirmation and would like to may also enroll in the program through arrangements with Pastor Cheryl. An independent study option is available for older youth who desire to complete the requirements.

First English and Zion Lutheran congregations combine their program each year with instruction generally held at First English Lutheran Church as it is just down the street from the school.

Once all requirements are complete, students make their Affirmation of Baptism on Reformation Sunday in October. This year that date is October 25th for both churches.

Students in 7th and 8th grade study the Old and New Testament of the Bible on a two-year rotation. This year's study is on the Old Testament. Ninth graders receive the Lutheran Core studying Luther's Small Catechism, and Lutheran History and Living to help them grow in faith, understand what we believe as Lutherans, and learn how to develop their own personal relationship with Christ.

Instruction for 2026-27 begins on September 9th at 3:30 pm for 7th and 8th and 4:30 pm for 9th graders. Classes on early out days are held at 1:45 pm with 9th graders at 2:45 pm.

A registration form is on the first page of the newsletter and will be on the Youth Facebook group page to download and complete prior to orientation night.

Signup sheets will also be available that evening for parents to sit in to class, offer snacks, offer food for the 5:30 pm youth meal.

Registration for Fall 1st Communion Classes

Children in 2nd grade on up from First English and Zion Lutheran are invited to participate in First Communion Classes this fall. Students are required to attend two hour-long classes. Classes will be held at First English on October 1st and 8th beginning at 3:30 pm depending on the grade of the child. Second and third graders will meet at 3:30. Fifth and sixth graders will meet at 4:30. Depending on numbers, the fourth graders may meet in either group.

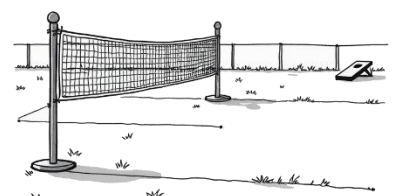
First Communion for the youth will be held on All-Saints Sunday, November 1.

For those unable to attend in the fall, classes will once again be held during Lent with First Communion on Palm Sunday. This second option allows for smaller classes and more opportunity to attend depending on the families' schedules.

Parish Nurse Article for August - Worry

Worry is to be uneasy in the mind, to feel anxiety about something, to fret. Interestingly it comes from the Old English word that means "to strangle". Worry strangles our peace of mind and our enjoyment of life. Worry affects us mentally, emotionally, spiritually, and physically. God instructs us not to worry, and Scripture overwhelms us with reasons for not being anxious.

Make God the Master that you serve. Our heavenly Father knows our material needs and will provide for them. "Therefore, don't worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself" (Matt. 6:34)

Here are a few steps toward freedom from worry:

- ❖ Plan time daily-even if it's only 15 minutes reading the Bible.
- ❖ Choose a phrase from Scripture or hymn that you can repeat to yourself at any hint of anxiety. "Tell it to Jesus" or "God cares for me" or "the Lord is my Shepherd; I shall not want."
- ❖ Play soothing music
- ❖ Design a plan of action. "What is in my control?"
- ❖ Replace worry with prayer.
- ❖ Get help from others if needed



If you are a worrier, God wants to heal you. He has given you His promises, His protection and His provision. We all have choices, we can keep worrying, ruin our mental and physical health, and retard our spiritual development OR We can cast our cares on the strong shoulders of our loving Savior who has promised to give us His peace.
